Branch Opening Hours

For a trial period from 4 July to 31 August 2023, Community Bank Epping will be closing at 4.00pm.

Branch hours will be from 9.30am -4.00pm, Monday to Friday, during this trial period.

The Bank Board has taken this decision based on data which has been collected over many months, showing a decreasing number of customer transactions between 4.00 and 5.00pm each day.

Closing at 4.00pm brings the branch in line with most other Bendigo Community Bank branches throughout NSW and will allow staff more time for long-term customer follow-up, lending-related activities, and compliance with statutory regulations.

However, customers will still be able to make specific appointments with the Manager after 4.00pm, in relation to loans and other major issues.

Evaluation of the trial will occur at the end of July and at the end of August.

A Message from Our Chairman



As we near the end of the financial year, I am pleased to report that the financial position of the Community Bank Epping remains very healthy, despite some difficult economic conditions and ongoing changes in the banking industry overall. We have maintained a solid

profit margin, thanks to sound leadership from our volunteer Board and the dedicated hard work of our staff, led by our excellent Branch Manager, Stephen Hu.

Our profits enable us to continue our support for the local community. We have recently committed funding to the Epping North Public School Sustainable Garden project, signed a three-year sponsorship agreement with North Epping Bowling and Community Club for their Epping Community Bank Champions Trophy tournament, extended our sponsorship arrangements with the North Epping Rangers Sports Club, and are negotiating funding support for special programs at the recently opened Ngarala Public School in Epping.

As well, we are committing a further \$10,000 to the ongoing Epping Mural Project, in conjunction with Parramatta Council and CBUS Property. This next phase will see a new mural on the walls of the Epping Library.

It is also centrally located so can be easily shipped to other local venues for a performance.
