Our history

In 2007 a committed group of local people got together to discuss the potential of securing full personal banking services in Leopold. Anyone who has been around long enough will know our closest banking was in Newcomb and at this time Gateway Plaza was in its early days of operations with stage 1 completed.

They contacted the Bendigo Bank which had a profit share franchise model operating, known as Community Banking. Operating the model since 1998, the Bendigo Bank Community Bank model was designed to feed into the prosperity of their customers and the local community. It was decided that this was just what our community needed, and the group formally created a Steering Committee consisting of dedicated people who had the skills to further investigate and implement the requirements to achieve this goal.

By September 2007, the Steering Committee had commenced acquiring pledges from locals to financially support the project. This process involved signage at various locations in the community, promotion through media outlets, direct contact with local businesses, a roster of volunteers speaking to the community at Gateway Plaza and a presence at various community events.

By the end of February 2008, the hard work was starting to pay off. The pledge total was \$554,500 and by May this jumped to \$683,000. With the financial investment by Lascorp (owners of Gateway Plaza at the time), by June total pledges numbered \$790,000. It is worth noting Lascorp remained investors long after selling Gateway Plaza. Without their commitment to the company, it would have taken much longer to achieve the target required. Once the target pledge amount was received, they set about undertaking a feasibility study. By mid-August 2008, the report from the feasibility study suggested the Community Bank Leopold proposition was favourable. A Business Plan was developed, further negotiations for a site were undertaken with Lascorp, discussions continued with Bendigo and Adelaide Bank; and a solicitor and accountant were engaged.

The Steering Committee registered the name for the company, and on the 8 September 2008 the inaugural meeting of Leopold Community Enterprises Limited was held.

As a result of intensive work by the Steering Committee, a prospectus launch was held in October 2008. Unfortunately, this was also the time of the Global Financial Crisis. The timing had an impact on converting pledges to actual share purchases but thanks to the wonderful support of the community and Lascorp, the target was met shortly after, which enabled Leopold Community Enterprises Limited to purchase a franchise of the Bendigo Bank.

Lascorp generously allowed access to the branch space before official tenancy commenced and the company set about employing local tradespeople to fit out the branch and recruiting branch staff. With all this complete, Community Bank Leopold opened its doors on 3 April 2009 to much fanfare in the community.

Our business

The focus of Community Bank Leopold, then and now, is to supply Bendigo Bank products and services to our community. The focus of the company – Leopold Community Enterprises Limited – and the Board is to support the Branch Manager, to recognise and reward shareholders by way of annual dividend payments; and to invest up to 80% of the profits, back to the community by way of grants, sponsorships, and donations.


Investing in the business has remained a focus of the Board and early on, included the purchase of a company car in Bank livery. The Board decided this was a requirement to enable the Branch Manager to undertake their role as well as a mobile marketing tool for the branch. The Board also invested in advertising on the vehicle itself, along with personalised number plates (LCBank) - the first of its kind and this continues to be a strong marketing tool.


Financially, over the past 15 years, total footings (below) have steadily grown from \$27.104 million in 2009 and to \$205.925 million in 2023.

Along the way, the company has been impacted by many factors outside of our control. Some of which included:

• The 2019 report from Royal Commission into Misconduct in the Banking, Superannuation and Financial Services Industry resulting in tighter lending throughout the sector, which can be seen in the reduction in the footings in 2020.

- Market competition in the provision of financial services has become especially strong. Bendigo Bank continues to focus on brand, technology and process simplification to drive efficiency and strengthen our relationships with customers.
- In 2023 Bendigo Bank was named the most trusted bank in Australia by Roy Morgan for the fifth consecutive quarter, climbing further ahead of competitors on the list of Australia's most trusted brands.
- Changes in interest rates over the time have impacted both lending and deposit rates and ultimately the company's margins – sometimes for the better and at other times proving to be a challenge.
- Like all businesses, we were hit with a major impact in 2020 when Covid-19 was declared a pandemic. The staff, with some minor operational changes, continued to support the community when we were all unsure of what was ahead. This did have an impact on the balance of footing, with a stronger than anticipated focus on deposits and a much greater reduction on lending.





 Most recently we were positively impacted operationally, with the closure of Bendigo Bank
Newcomb and the Bendigo Bank owned ATM at Gateway Plaza. These closures resulted in significant increases in over-the-counter transactions and for the first time, queues for service. To counter this influx, the Board invested in growing staff numbers and the installation of an ATM to ensure continuing customer service excellence.

Through continual changing global and domestic market conditions, the financial performance of the company remains solid. The profit after income tax expense remains positive, enabling the Board to invest in the operational requirements of Community Bank Leopold, our branch, our shareholders and the community.

Over the years we have had the opportunity to celebrate many achievements. In 2018, Community Bank Leopold was recognised by Bendigo Bank for their outstanding team achievement as finalists for the 2017/18 Regional Victoria and Tasmania Branch of the Year, an amazing acknowledgement of the incredible work of our branch staff.

In April 2019 celebrations were held for our customers in-branch, and with an event for shareholders, acknowledging the successes of our first 10 years (pictured below left and middle). The day included a high tea for the shareholders and many festivities in the branch. On 12 September 2019, Community Bank Leopold was honoured to receive the Lions Club of Leopold, Alan J Holding Award. It was presented honouring the valuable contribution Community Bank Leopold has made in assisting the Leopold community. The award was presented by the Lions Club District Governor, to Lily Reinert (Chair) and Bronwyn Shearer (Company Secretary) of Leopold Community Enterprises Limited (below right).

As we look towards the next 15 years, if the recent past has taught us anything, you never know what's around the corner. But whatever unfolds, we are confident our community will continue to support each other and we will continue to build strong relationships with our stakeholders (our staff, our shareholders, the community and our partner, Bendigo and Adelaide Bank) to ensure we continue to be:


Our shareholders

Without the support of our pioneering initial shareholders, it is fair to say Community Bank Leopold would never have been established to service our community.


The support of our initial investors has continued, with the majority of shares being held by the same persons or handed down to family members. When shares have been sold, they are often purchased by current shareholders who are wanting to increase their holding. On the few occasions when shares become available, we are pleased that the demand to support the company is strongly evident.

The current number of shareholders stands at 208, which consists of 147 original shareholders and pleasingly, some new people to our community. The age of current shareholders varies dramatically as seen in the table below. It is pleasing to see the young people who are either purchasing the shares themselves or are given them from family members are holding onto their shares and supporting their community's future.

The Community Bank model recognises this company investment by way of shareholder dividends. Our first unfranked dividends were paid in 2012 and again in 2013. Since then, franked dividends have been paid to shareholders annually. 2023 saw a particularly strong financial performance with a record franked dividend paid to shareholders of \$0.15 per share. We are pleased to report that as of November 2023 we have returned \$600,685.47 in dividends to our shareholders.



We thank the past and current shareholders for their investment in the company as their commitment is vital to securing the future of banking services in Leopold.

Our staff

Current branch staff

Our premises

The branch opened its doors at Gateway Plaza on 3 April 2009 with the premises being first in the region to be fitted out according to the new branch design. As business grew, a mini facelift was undertaken in 2015 – six years later. This included addition of a new Branch Manager's office, changes to internal walls to enable better viewing of the main office area and a fresh coat of paint to the inside of the building with new decals to the exterior.

After 13 years, the Board committed to a full exterior facelift of the premises to bring it in line with the new Bendigo Bank branding and current requirements for our community. The branding provides all Bendigo Bank premises with a consistent narrative focussing on creating pride among staff and helping to leverage the company's powerful combination of trust and capability.

At the same time, given the removal of the Bendigo Bank ATM from the entrance to Gateway Plaza and the closure of the Bendigo Bank Newcomb branch, for the first time, the Board invested in the installation of an ATM to support our customers. This has been very well received by our customers and has resulted in new customers to Community Bank Leopold. To counter the ever-rising costs associated with being located in a major shopping centre, in 2020 the Board commenced the search for suitable premises to purchase in order to secure the future of the branch. With limited options available in Leopold and after much searching, the company announced at the 2023 Annual General Meeting that they had the opportunity to purchase our own building in the Dorothy Street shopping strip. This investment will result in greater control over expenses and the release of additional funds to support our community and shareholders.

The process is now underway to design and build a new branch which will be a fresh, modern design that is welcoming to customers and provides more conducive workspaces for our staff. The new location provides an opportunity for future expansion, ensuring it is suitable for the years ahead. It is anticipated that the new location will open its doors by the end May 2024.

Our community

Banking is our business - Community is our purpose. This statement guides why the company exists and is at the forefront of our operations at both the Community Bank Leopold and Board level.

Our first community investments were made in 2009 with \$28,400 donated across 9 projects/community groups. Some funds were made available through access to the Bendigo Bank Marketing Development Fund. This early access to funds enabled greater promotion of the business, resulting in greater buy-in from the community, as they saw early on the benefits of banking locally.

By 2011 this amount had doubled to \$57,800 across 19 projects/community groups. In the following 4 years, community investments reached more than \$500,000. By the end of 2017, this investment had almost doubled to \$998,000. In 2023 alone, the company has invested over \$270,000 across 43 projects, whilst our current total community investment is an amazing \$2 million. This direct financial support is just part of our story.

The company has provided seed funding and advocated on behalf of the community with local, state and



federal funding bodies for many projects throughout the community, including development projects for the Leopold Hall, Leopold Sports Pavilion, Leopold Tennis Club and Bellarine Rail Trail to name a few.

We continue to seek projects that have a positive impact on our community and are pleased to say these community investments continue to grow. Whether you are young or young at heart, it is almost certain that you have benefitted from something that Community Bank Leopold has supported. Here are some of our stories.

Our 3 biggest investments

Leopold Community and Learning Centre

Following a Community Needs Study in 2013, the Board established the Centre in Ash Road and funded its operations for the first four years until funding was granted under the Neighbourhood House Victoria program. With the opening of the Leopold Community Hub, Leopold Community and Learning Centre relocated to Kensington Road. They continue to be supported with grants for equipment and specific programs and the Centre continues to be one of our largest community investments.





Leopold Sports Pavilion facilities upgrade

The investment in the fit out of the Leopold Sports Pavilion has resulted in a facility that not only benefits the sporting club tenants but is used by the broader community for meetings and events. The significance of the building name "The Club" represents a place where all people can come together. We are fortunate to have such a wonderful facility which is used by so many within the community.

Kids Day Out (Easter Egg Hunt – Good Friday)

Royal Children's Hospital Appeal fundraiser

Funded and organised by Community Bank Leopold, the Kids Day Out fundraiser ran from 2011 to 2017. The Good Friday Appeal event was a lovely way of bringing the community together for a wonderful cause. Although now discontinued, we are working with other parties to establish a community event to support our local families in the coming years.



The power of partnerships

The concept of Community Banking is one of partnerships. Community Bank Leopold has appreciated being part of the remarkable outcomes that can be achieved when people come together with a common vision. Some of these projects include:

Bendigo Bank House (McKellar Kids Rehabilitation Centre)

By partnering with other Community Banks in the region and Bendigo Bank regional office, a fantastic project resulted in the establishment of a specialised Kids Rehabilitation Unit (Bendigo Bank House) at Grace McKellar. The stateof-the-art Unit opened in April 2022 and provides specialised rehabilitation services for young people aged 0-25 from across the Barwon South region.





Geelong Youth Engagement (Kokoda Youth program)

The company has been honoured to partner with Geelong Youth Engagement for the Kokoda Youth program for a number of years. This project engages with young people to help them through the challenges they are facing in their lives. The participants undertake an intensive year long program which includes personal development, fitness, health, diet and most importantly role modelling with stable and genuine support. Our partnership is direct with GYE and indirectly with the Lions Club of Leopold who have an annual fundraiser of which Community Bank Leopold are sponsors.

Leopold Lions Club - Children's Vision Screening Program

In 2019, combined funding through the local Community Banks Collaborative Marketing Fund allowed the purchase of the camera and testing apparatus for the Children's Vision Screening Program across the region. In 2023, the success of the program resulted in an investment by Leopold for the purchase of a second camera.



Friend in Me

Community Banks Leopold and Lara teamed up to support the 2023 and 2024 Friend in Me Family Fun Day. This signature fundraising event was held at the Geelong Racecourse and promoted social inclusion and acceptance in children. An allability event saw the magic in the eyes of all children as they laughed, danced, and created lifelong memories. It is intended that this will be an ongoing partnered event.





Wombats Wish

Across Australia, one in twenty children, before the age of eighteen, will experience the death of a parent. Given that averages around one child in every classroom, we are honoured to combine with the region's Community Banks to support Wombats Wish in their provision of a free weekend camp for children and the surviving parent/carer from the greater Geelong area.



Tee-up for Kids

Over several years Community Bank Leopold supported a Geelong event for Tee-up for Kids. Funds raised from the event went towards providing children who live out-of-home, educational assistance to allow their best opportunity to learn, to integrate into the community and to break the barriers of disadvantage they face.

The voice of our community

In addition to the annual grants and sponsorships provided, the Board has taken an active role in ascertaining what is important to our community. In 2013 and again in 2019, the Board undertook a Community Needs Survey to identify specific community requirements.

As a result of the surveys, the Board has either directly implemented outcomes or advocated on behalf of the community for projects to be undertaken. Examples of projects that have been enacted from the Community Needs Study include.


Leopold Community and Learning Centre

The community requested a neighbourhood house which could offer varied programs, community activities and services. In 2014, the Board established the Centre and



funded its operations for the first four years. It continues today as a central hub for community activities. Without the hard work of the Board at the time, this Centre would not be the central hub of the community it is today.

Being a growing area with many new families, the company has invested in the creation, publication, and circulation of a community directory, to assist residents in familiarising themselves with what is available in our wonderful community. This is produced bi-annually and is also available digitally. It is given to local real estate agencies as part


of a welcome pack and is available at various locations throughout the community.

Business networking

The Leopold community consists of many tradespeople and business owners who work from home. As a result, the company has organised two events, at the Sportsmans Club and McGlashan's Winery, in which local businesses can come together to share their experiences. A business breakfast has also been held at the branch at which business owners were presented with information from Bendigo Bank's Business Banking team with time allocated to ask questions directly related to their own situation and requirements. The feedback from attendees from these events was extremely positive.

The Paddock Summer Markets and Pumpkin Fair

Events bringing the community together are regularly highlighted. In addition to the Kids Day Out, the company supported another event to bring the community together. In conjunction with Encompass, the

Development of FC Leopold (Estuary)

With football (soccer) a popular and growing sport in our community, the establishment of suitable facilities was identified. The Board provided seed funding for the project and with government funding also received, FC Leopold established the club and grounds you see today. Seed funding is a wonderful way to leverage our limited resources and to have the greatest impact on community facilities and we have used this process for several significant projects throughout the community.



Leopold Library

The community identified the need for a library. The Board contacted the City of Greater Geelong with the outcomes of the survey and encouraged them to consider establishing a library in Leopold. This is now located in the Community Hub on Kensington Road.



Lighting on the Bellarine Rail Trail

The SMART lighting pilot project was supported by advocating on behalf of the community. The announcement



of the project in March 2020 expanded to include various bus stops and Gateway Sanctuary. We continue to work with the Friends of the Bellarine Rail Trail to ensure the Trail is a safe and inviting space for the community.

Knowledge of government information and projects

The company recognised that an effective way of disseminating information in the community was through the monthly Leopold Local. Given this request, the company connected the Lions Club with the local government and state members of Parliament who continue to submit information for each edition of the Leopold Local.

Carpark issues at Gateway Plaza

Although a private business, the Board notified Gateway Plaza of the identified parking and drainage issues. They have undertaken a carpark review and continue to manage the drainage issues and have plans for future improvement.
