Hello everyone, allow me to introduce myself. My name is Joy Ball, I am a relationship counsellor and proud business





Balcombe Pre-School

Each year Community Bank Mount Martha offers their staff the opportunity to donate \$1,000 to a Not-For-Profit Community Group they have a connection or association with. Our Senior Customer Service officer Narelle Lear has this year chosen Balcombe Pre-School. Balcombe Preschool is a community-focused and



parent-run preschool based in Mt Martha. Narelle's three children all attended this kinder, and she has had a long association with the kinder and knows many of the staff who are still working at the kinder some 20 years on from when her first child started. Narelle thought it was timely to donate to this community group as she, like many in our community, is aware of the struggles the kinder faced early this year and how important it is having local kindergartens.

In January, just four days out from the start of the new year, the school received notification that due to some issues being found within its buildings, the programs would have to be cancelled. The then school president Dan Steele said, "We had no building, no kinder site, no program, and no back up space". But thanks to local community support, particularly from Mount Martha Primary School and Community Kinders Plus at Mount Martha House hosting the preschool students and supporting staff, within a two-week window the kinder kids were relocated, and the kids only missed two weeks at the very beginning of the term. The kinder volunteers, parents and the staff, and of course the wider community rolled up their sleeves and helped the kinder continue to provide this vital service.

Dan said, "it turned an emergency relocation into a community building event that made the kinder committee, families and staff closer and connected".

This story really resonated with Narelle, as she is passionate about supporting her community and loves working for a Community Bank. The Community Bank concept was developed to provide communities with banking services and access to funding. Whether revitalising a local shopping strip, directing profits to community projects, or supporting schools, charities and sporting clubs, Community Bank branches continue to prove that many hands make light work. Just by doing something as simple as your banking, the same things happen in our local Mount Martha community; just like the branch supporting Balcombe Pre-School. Narelle said, "the more people that support us by bringing their banking, loans and insurances etc to us, the more we can support our community".

Balcombe Pre-School staff and past president were thrilled to accept the cheque from Narelle. The funds will go towards providing a new carpentry table for woodwork and water trough for water play!


Large crowd at 2023 Carols by the Bay


