Club of Leeuwin the shed is now on a sound financial footing and well established. It has been operating for three years and provides a very worthwhile and positive men's health outcome. It has an established social room where a regular group play pool and others attend cooking classes or simply just relax and socialise with other men. The workshop area is well equipped and well patronised. These areas are integral to the main objective which is to care for the health and wellbeing of the men in our town. You hear men talking to other men about how they are feeling, some of whom are receiving medical treatment for depression or have been diagnosed with cancer, have a heart problem or are simply lonely and isolated. The shed is a place of choice to belong, to socialise with other men and do worthwhile things. There is a support mechanism among mates. A member has attended a Suicide Intervention Workshop in Margaret River and there is direct access to Regional Men's Health councillors. The shed is open four days a week manned by volunteers but available to members 24/7.

This has been a very worthwhile local project the bank, its shareholders and customers have supported and been involved in establishing in Augusta for the benefit of the community.

Community investments.

Big nationally, Rugby Union, like Bendigo Bank, is not so familiar to folk in the south west districts. A recent collaboration between the Groupers Rugby Team and our local **Community Bank®** branch hope to raise the profile of both organisations.
