Community and Student Forums

Our Community and Student Forums on 15 November were a fantastic success.

Sixty representatives of forty-four community groups came together with staff and Directors at Balnarring Primary School to share their big ideas and identify community projects that could be undertaken with funds generated by the Balnarring & District **Community Bank**[®] Branch, or as government and community partnerships. A number of key projects were identified, including:

Earlier in the day, the bank also hosted a Student Forum, where Year 5 students from Balnarring and Somers Primary Schools were invited to identify projects that would benefit all students at their schools. Each school will be awarded a grant of \$1,000 for their preferred project.

Students also discussed projects for their broader communities and it was interesting that they came up with some similar ideas to those discussed at the Community Forum.
