#### Western Port Community Support

Funding provided towards our Housing and Homelessness Program has ensured critical and responsive housing support is available to

those who are either homeless or facing homelessness in the Western Port region. The program relies on community and philanthropic funding and in the past 12 months has supported 82 acutely homeless clients and 89 individuals or families from becoming homeless and falling into the crisis system. Funding for this program from Community Bank Balnarring & District over the past three years has allowed us to make a positive impact upon our most vulnerable and disadvantaged community.



Our broader community has again generously donated toys for the WPCS Christmas Giving Program for 300 local families. The Community Bank also contributed funds for the purchase of aroceries for Christmas hampers.

#### MP Koala Conservation

#### Balnarring Community Child Care

Balnarring Community Child Care would like to express our gratitude to Community Bank Balnarring & District for the ongoing support they provide. With recent sponsorship from the bank, we have been able to replace our three large shade sails to provide children with shelter outdoors. The funds have also allowed us to have two rain water tanks installed, which will enrich outdoor water play experiences and provide children with opportunities to learn about caring for our environment and sustainability.



## Supporting our local CFA brigades

Your Community Bank understands the importance of the vital work our many CFA volunteers undertake to protect our communities, keeping us safe by providing fire and other emergency services. We have strong relationships with our local brigades and are delighted that your banking enables us to continue supporting them and help fund a range of resources.

All CFA brigades rely on community funding to help support their operations. Over the past twelve months your banking has seen us reinvest more than \$57,000 in local brigades, so our customers can feel very proud of their choice of bank as we approach another summer fire season.

#### Bittern Fire Brigade

As volunteers, CFA members are not paid for their service, but this volunteering does incur costs. Our support to fund dress uniforms for brigade members meant all 32 now have a full set for those occasions on which this is required, allowing them to feel a sense of pride in their commitment to their brigade and their community.



In December 2022, your Community Bank contributed significant funds towards the cost of a new Tanker for the brigade. This tanker will provide enhanced crew protection, extra water storage and modern fire-fighting equipment as members continue to support their local community, other Peninsula brigades and communities across the state.







#### **Balnarring Fire Brigade**

Emergency situations may require access to buildings or vehicles to extinguish fires or rescue people. If time permits, gaining access without damaging property may be possible as long as appropriate tools are available. By funding the purchase of a range of battery-powered tools, we have enabled members to work safely and effectively.

Some of these tools were used to rescue a young child from playground equipment soon after they were acquired. Another win-win because you bank with us.







To enable training in all weather over a greater area and to allow the use of their new, heavier tanker in the pump training area, the brigade needed to extend the hardstand area around the station.

Without the capacity to train members effectively, brigades are less able to attract new volunteers and keep those volunteers and their communities safe, so your Community Bank was pleased to cover the costs of these works.

The All-Terrain Vehicle we funded has become a vital piece of equipment as Merricks Coolart Catchment Landcare group begins the exciting work of revegetating 30 acres of former pasture in Balnarring. This land is the rear section of the Presentation Sisters property and borders Merricks Creek, so will provide significant additional habitat for local fauna and flora.



Shoreham Community Association has produced a book of 12 walks in and around Shoreham, showcasing foreshore, village and rural areas, history, the natural environment and Shoreham today. We were pleased to contribute \$5,000 to this initiative
