# Sashiko and Boro – the Japanese philosophy of 'mottaini' or 'waste not, want not'

As part of our commitment to the environment, our Community Bank ran a fascinating workshop to introduce these ancient Japanese mending techniques to twelve of our wonderful customers and supporters.

Sashiko, a traditional Japanese form of decorative reinforcement stitching and Boro, the art of mending and patching, are not just techniques; they are a way to connect with history, sustainability, and creativity and just as importantly, to mend and cherish resources, rather than seeing them end up in landfill.

# Merricks Coolart Catchment Landcare Group and Saltbush revegetation project

Over the past two years, Merricks Coolart Catchment Landcare group has partnered with Saltbush to revegetate 30 acres of former pasture land at the back of the property, creating a significant area of new habitat for local flora and fauna, which will be protected into the future. Over 7,000 indigenous plants have gone in over this time.

This unique project has been a wonderful example of a community partnership between these two groups, local volunteers, government agencies and our Community Bank, which has supported the vital environmental work of the Landcare group since 2019 and has contributed significant funds and resources to this special project.
