As seen across the Big 4 Banks, our operations have delivered an exceptional result for the 2022/23 year, with our audited trading profit being \$874,701. This result has been driven primarily by the increasing cash rate regime since May 2022, together with our increasing business on our books.

In terms of our franchise agreement, we have contributed \$403,739 back to community groups by way of sponsorship and donations amounting to \$399,904 with the balance being in marketing and advertising expenses with community traders. The balance of our trading profit is retained for operating expenses and dividend payments.

Our forecast trading budget for the 2023/24 year is \$854,087. While slightly less than the 2022/23 results, it is driven by foreseen interest rates margins remaining constant and continued maturity/rollover of fixed-rate loans. Depending on actual results achieved, we foresee Community Contributions increasing for the year. The table above shows our monthly trading results for the year and 2023/24 budgeted results.

25th Anniversary Celebrations

Bendigo Bank's unique Community Bank model celebrated 25 years of community owned and operated banking in Australia.

The Pakenham-Berwick Gazette printed a very positive article about our Branch in July 2023 edition.

Journalist Corey Everitt worked with our Chairman, Graeme Taylor, with support from our then Branch Manager, Andrew Gardner, and Board Members David Nutter, Karen Chipperfield, Carol Porter, Shemane Nathanielsz, Maurice Potter, and Ted French to bring the article to life.

The article focused on Bendigo Bank's unique Community Bank model which is celebrating 25 years of community-owned and operated banking in Australia.

The internationally acclaimed model has grown from a concept designed to empower communities at risk of losing face-to-face banking services to a network of more than 300 branches nationally with \$20 billion in loans and \$31.3 billion in deposits.

Founded in 1998 with branches in Rupanyup and Minyip, the secret to its success can be traced back to the profit-with-a-purpose model which sees a majority of the profits generated by each independently owned and operated Community Banks directed back into the community.

Collectively, the Community Bank model is on track to return a total of \$300 million in profits in its anniversary year since inception. Community Bank funding often attracts co-investors such as local, state and federal governments creating a multiplier effect on the capital raised which has enabled projects totalling over an estimated \$1 billion.

We would also like to acknowledge the work of the Branch team, who have been the driving force behind the success of our Branch and the Community Grants Program and building the profile of our Branch.
