On Friday 28 March 2014 Beaufort **Community Bank**[®] Branch held their Fill the "B" \$1 million launch at the Beaufort **Community Bank**[®] Complex. Over 100 people were in attendance on the night and were entertained by local Bush Poet Colin Driscoll. Local resident Robert Wood provided a poem for Col to read which described the closing of all three banks and the railway in the town which lead the Beaufort community forming a Committee to establish a **Community Bank**[®] branch.

Presentations were made to Beaufort & Skipton Health Service of a cheque for \$2,000 for sponsorship for the Murray to Moyne relay held on 5 and 6 April and to the Board's Young Director, Jake Morcombe who received an engraved pen for his service and contributions to the Board over the past 12 months.

Branch Manager Simon Robinson and Founding Director and Beaufort resident Robert Wood unveiled the Fill the "B" barometer which has been placed on the outside wall of the branch to show the progress of the contributions to the community.
