Hall gets a boost with seating grant



The original Freeburgh Hall was built in 1905 but was declared unfit for use in 2005, just two months shy of it's 100th birthday.

The Freeburgh Recreational & Public Hall Committee with local assistance built an impressive new Hall and made it available to the community as a fully functional community facility.

The committee partnered with the Alpine Carers Group to apply to the Bright Community Grants Program to purchase chairs for the hall. They aptly named their venture "Bottoms Upon Magical Seating".

The chairs had to comply with Occupational Health and Safety guidelines and commercial standards as the hall is a public facility requiring adequate and sturdy chairs.

Also, the chairs help to provide a clean, safe facility for all members of the community to use in all circumstances, gatherings, celebrations, information sessions, weekly health sessions and unexpected meetings in times of natural disasters.

The joint venture received a \$5,000 Grant from the Bright Community Grants Program which has enabled 50 chairs to be purchased for the hall.

Bright Community Grants Program is administered by Community Enterprise Foundation™ in partnership with Bright **Community Bank**® Branch.

Bright Police – Trailer purchase \$2,000



Members of Bright Police approached Bright **Community Bank**® Branch for help with the purchase of a trailer to carry two off-road motorcycles donated by Honda as part of a program initiated by the TAC.

Four police officers were selected for training in the use

of off-road motorcycles. The trailer will assist by transporting the motorcycles to help make the program a success. It is envisaged the initiative will have a positive impact locally by reducing off-road trauma incidents as well as reducing traffic law breaches.

Bright Fun Run – Gold sponsorship \$3,000

The fun run was supported by Bright P-12 and for the second year Bright **Community Bank**® Branch as event gold sponsors. After its success last year, the event was going to be bigger and better with an anticipated 300 runners taking part in the 2, 5 and 10km running events as well as a 2km family-friendly walk.
