Innovation from a Global Pandemic

In the face of uncertainty and a global pandemic, the Ballarat community came together to back the locally created "GeVentor" project. The GeVentor is an Australian designed and manufactured ventilator developed as a response to COVID-19. The unit is easy to use, has simple start-up procedures but with additional, more sophisticated functionality. It's highly robust which means it can be transported and used in regional and remote environments.

Our Community Bank worked with the Committee for Ballarat, Ballarat Health Services, Gekko Systems (Gekko Medical) and the broader community to provide the gap needed to secure additional Government funding.

"Gekko Medical is extremely thankful for the investment - without investors none of this would have been possible. The new med tech would not been horn.

The initial investment helped us get further Government support. Thanks to the Community Bank we were able to put Ballarat on the map".

Coming Together for Cancer Research

In true Community Bank style, four local branches (Buninyong, Creswick, Ballan and Beaufort) collaborated to fund the new Bendigo Bank Tissue Bank at the Fiona Elsey Cancer Research Centre (FECRI).

The Tissue Bank is a collection of human tissues stored as live cells in liquid nitrogen at -190°C and used later in FECRI's cancer research program. Community Bank funding allowed for an upgrade to the facility and relocation to a designated area in the laboratory.

"This expansion is key to the ground-breaking work that the team at the Institute is doing into the immunology of cancer. It is only through research that we can improve the outcomes for patients with cancer. Our program is building great momentum and will continue to achieve positive outcomes."

Message From The Chair

Hi and welcome to our very first Community Impact Snapshot.

We are justifiably proud of delivering on our purpose of building the community. We live the mantra of "feeding into prosperity, not off it" and our leadership is recognised and rewarded by the growth and trust of our customers.

Community investment goes to the very heart of what we do - to build a healthy thriving community driven by a healthy thriving Community Bank. It's about delivering shared value for every stakeholder and the communities we operate in.

The second half of the financial year saw an event few would have predicted. In a year that could be described as many things apart from a world-wide health pandemic, it has been the most challenging, economically and socially disruptive, personally confronting and history-shaping period that we will ever see in our lives.

With the Australian banking system deemed to be an "essential service", we focussed on delivering as much normality as possible albeit behind masks, screens and sanitising solution. We closed for Saturday trade during lockdown and re-commenced this service in November. A combination of a historically low cash rate and economic stimulus of first-home buyer incentives has seen an enormous rise in the volume of both enquiries and domestic home loans coming to the branch.

In the last financial year, our branch has seen enormous growth in a number of areas including size of footings to over \$200m, operating profit to over \$500,000, doubled the number of accounts for the size of the town's population whilst increasing staff numbers, increased shareholder equity to \$1.13 per share and paid a record dividend of 10c per share.

As the unrelenting Covid-19 crisis rolls on, we know the future will be a new frontier. The old joke is that nostalgia isn't what it used to be either. In our industry, we know the pandemic has changed everything, however what hasn't changed is our commitment to purpose, community and customer-first culture.

We look forward with optimism buoyed by the thought that what we do positively impacts the communities we serve. We love what we do and will continue to serve our communities with a passion long into the future.






