




Similarly, we supported the community of Warrenheip independently design their own Community Action Plan which includes a future project to develop the recreation reserve complete with wetlands and walking tracks.

Their specifically designed and engineered miniature FI car was powered by a CO2 canister and put through its paces on a 20m track. Team Nexus took out the Knockout Racing and Innovation Award.

We supported Team Nexus simply because we know how important STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) is in promoting career paths for primary and secondary students. This event is the largest STEM competition in the world and our local heros will head to Singapore to represent Australia.

The team are not only required to design and build their vehicles, but manage an enterprise includin budgeting, securing sponsorship and event management.
