New clubhouse for Roosters

The idea of a Rooster's shed/clubhouse was born over a few beers as a couple of us were talking about the footy club and its humble beginnings to where we could see it heading. It was very clear that the club needed to have a place, a clubhouse, where we could acknowledge those that came before us, and also a place to display our silverware, team photos and any other memorabilia.

Over the next couple of years, the club applied for various forms of funding through both Federal and State Government funding opportunities, as well as private enterprise and local Council. As with most sporting organisations, we operate from year-to-year financially. To meet the guidelines of most funding streams, the club needed to contribute significantly. About three years ago the club learnt of the possibility of funding through Gladstone Regional Council and a program funded by the State Government called 'Works for Queensland'. The club pitched our idea to Council of not only a complex for the Calliope Rugby League, but also for the broader Calliope community; one which incorporated not only the Roosters' needs but allowed the complex to be used for various indoor sports and events.

Gladstone Regional Council liked our idea and committed a significant amount of funding for the project.

Our goal of a modern clubhouse, now a multi-use complex, had been given 'life'. It was at this time that we ran into Chair Jo Hill at the local coffee shop and gave her a very quick overview of what we were about to undertake and to see if the Calliope & District Community Bank would like to support the project.

As we progressed through the construction the conversations became more frequent and eventually led to a formal request for funding from Calliope & District Community Bank. Thankfully, our application was approved and an incredible gift of \$150,000 was made available to Calliope Junior Rugby League. This additional funding allowed the club to install a state-of-the-art playing surface within the complex, allowing multiple sports to be played. The state-of-the-art surface also provided the ability for a variety of functions to be held.

The generosity of the Calliope & District Community Bank has enabled our club's dream of a clubhouse to become a reality. The feet of hundreds of local children, teenagers and adults will traffic the floor of our new sporting complex, creating many memories and building our community spirit.
