### History of our **Community Bank®** Branch.

The campaign to bring a **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> branch to Clovelly began in 1999 when the Commonwealth Bank closed its doors on the Clovelly shopping strip. In 2000 Christine Gardiner, a local shopkeeper formed a Steering Committee to raise awareness and capital to establish the Clovelly **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> Branch in Clovelly. After numerous public meetings, sufficient capital was raised to facilitate the fit out of a vacant shop.

In July 2002, our first Manager Pat Monnox with four staff opened our branch. In the first two years we had opened over 1,800 accounts and written a total of \$32 million in business.

After five years we paid our first dividend of a modest 2 cents per share to our faithfully patient shareholders.

In June 2012, our 10th anniversary, we purchased the property we had occupied since 2002, securing the future of the branch's operations for many more years. Business was good, and in January 2013 we were able to pay a fully franked dividend of 0.13 cents per share.

Now celebrating 15 years in 2017, we hold over 5,200 accounts and have almost reached \$200 million in business.

### Contributions to our community.

The Clovelly **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> Branch is proud to support a diverse range of local community initiatives through its sponsorships and grants program. While some groups have sought funding for a specific project or emergency aid, others have required longer term support through a reoccurring sponsorship.

Our first sponsorship of \$250 was provided to the Lurline Bay Tenants association. Within 10 years we had contributed over \$500,000 to the community. Today, we are proud to celebrate that over \$1 million of branch profits have been reinvested into more than 100 local community programs and initiatives, thanks to the commitment of our banking customers.

#### **Coogee Dolphins.**

Coogee Dolphins is a not-for-profit sports club that fields Netball and junior Rugby League teams in the local area. It provides a safe environment for local children to participate in sport, promoting a healthy lifestyle and an environment that promotes respect for teamwork and team mates whilst having fun.

## anch. Purple Hearts Football 1999 Club.



The Clovelly **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> Branch has been an important and active supporter of the Randwick City Football Club for seven years, since its inception in 2010. Financial assistance from the branch enabled the club to start the Purple Hearts, a team of footballers with a disability who are able to enjoy all aspects of the game.

Purple Hearts play for 30 weeks a year and there is no cost to the players or parents. The **Community Bank**® branch's financial support helps buy gear and equipment such as uniforms and soccer balls. The funds also assist with the hiring of coaching assistants to shadow players to ensure they follow instructions and get the most out of each training session. Three to four times per year the players participate in gala days and in summer the seniors play in the Football NSW Athletes with Disabilities Football Competition. The branch's help also covers the cost of hiring venues and a minibus to travel to the venues.

All players are provided with trophies at season's end to mark their contributions to the team. The program for the Purple Hearts is the only one of its kind in the eastern suburbs. The primary benefits are that young men and women with a disability are able to participate in sport and through this, become more active members of the community. Purple Hearts players, some of whom have quite severe intellectual and physical disabilities, have improved their health, motor skills and general well being, and grown in confidence on and off the pitch as a direct result of their participation in the Purple Hearts program.

Since 2010, some 70 people with a disability have participated in the program. Purple Hearts currently have 35 players: 20 juniors and 15 seniors. You can find out more at rcfc.org.au


BOP workers provide basic first aid, safe transport home and practical assistance with complex issues that face many young people today, such as the lack of safe accommodation, family support, health concerns and legal assistance.
