Young Trades Awards 2021 Winners Presentation at Trentham Men's Shed.

Wednesday 21st of April 2021 in Trentham dawned beautifully clear and very cold! It was only 2 degrees at 7am, which challenges anyone including tradies. A FREE Breakfast, hosted by Trentham & Districts Community Bank, at our very own Trentham Men's Shed, made the icy morning more bearable. Thankfully, we had the BBQ sizzling, tea & coffee steaming and a well-equipped & warm venue available.

As local tradies gathered, and nominees for the Young Trades awards arrived, the presentation got started. Sean Leech (Bendigo Bank Regional Manager) and Board Members Stan Falloon & Charl Parris opened proceedings, thanking all those involved in getting the Young Trades Awards off the ground and making it such a huge success in its first year. The efforts of all the businesses that participated are much appreciated.

The Young Trades Awards 2021 was a pilot program invented, developed and driven by Cool Country Community Enterprises and Trentham & Districts Community Bank. "Supporting local and keeping it local" is at the very core of the community banking model, which this program fits perfectly.

The focus of this initiative was on the young people & businesses within our towns & communities. It showcased the opportunities for working and learning a skill-set right here in our own backyard. We felt it was important to create visibility by acknowledging and rewarding these young people within our region, especially those actively engaged in their community.

As a community-based program, we were mindful not to cross boundaries and to focus things within our specific area. We're already using what we've learned to tweak things - making changes to improve for next year. We can see endless opportunities in the future to collaborate with and involve other local groups. The response to the Young Trades Award program was very strong and we were overwhelmed by the volume of nominees. We had a total of 48 entrants, scaled down to 21, with a final shortlist of 9 who were all interviewed by a panel. This is an incredible result and congratulations to all of you who were nominated.

For our first category, it was extremely hard to separate two finalists - like splitting hairs. A unanimous decision was made to award both of them. The 'Apprentice or Trainee - Employed' Award goes to two local Trenthamites - Sibusiso Maphosa and Dolf Reid.
