### Collaboration with Hepburn Shire (HSC) on Economic Storm Recovery

The HSC Storm Recovery Team have been amazing in their support of our community and, with so much activity here in Trentham, when they approached the Community Bank Trentham & Districts branch it made sense to work together. Collaboration is our favourite way to get things done!

A perfect opportunity to get the ball rolling and engage with the community was to focus on addressing business needs. Narelle Conroy from Hepburn Shire Council hosted a 'Main Street Commerce Catch up' event with the local traders of Trentham, to openly discuss topics that supported the town, local businesses and retailers. It was great to see everyone participate and put what they wanted on the table. The session included guest speakers - Isobel Kemp, Mental Health Clinician Consultant from 'Partners In Well-Being' who offered free counselling and support services to local business and Kevin O'Loughlin a local who represents Jobs Victoria - sharing valuable information for those who want to work on, and grow, their business. The Victorian State Government has a number of subsidies and programs (including mentoring) to steer employers and employees in the right direction.

Feedback from the evening was strong around getting Trentham on the map. Without an operating 'Information Centre' this has been very challenging for businesses (particularly through Covid19). It is important for businesses to know what each other are doing, especially when answering questions from visitors and tourists. Armed with this information, Charl Parris (our Community Engagement Officer) actively gathered relevant information about local businesses and put together a printed 'Community Brochure', now available at the Bank and at several local businesses. At the same time, Narelle and Charl started working on a plan to create a local Business Directory website. The website will include all business & trades and will be linked to the Trentham Trumpet and Trentham Neighbourhood Centre for community news and activities. The Board has approved community investment funding in conjunction with the Storm Recovery Funding team to get the website built. It will be managed by the Community Bank Trentham & Districts. "It makes perfect sense" said Brian Hood, Board Co-Chair, "and gives all local businesses a clear and direct link to the Bank. We are more than a financial institution - we are a community bank and giving back & supporting our community is the reason we exist in the first place. We opened the bank 11 years ago and have watched the businesses grow in this town. It's the perfect relationship to have with the business community. It's not a case of build it and they will come - it's about businesses being invested in this community initiative."

We're ready to move ahead with this project and are now gathering more information from businesses who have been invited to register their interest in participating. The Business Directory website is planned for release at the annual Trentham Twilights event in December, which is also jointly funded by the Bank and HSC Storm Recovery.









## Trentham's Future Footprint

August was a big month with lots of insightful information provided that supported our interest in becoming a resilient township.

As a small town, we understand extreme weather conditions and the events of the big storm last year led us to partner with the Trentham Sustainability Group to dive deeper into exploring sustainable energy options that we could implement in our backyard.

There was a big turnout at the TSG-organised 'Community Information Forum' held on 4 August to hear the results of the 'Energy and Climate Resilient Trentham' project feasibility study. Middleton Group Consultants, Roger Brown, Principal Electrical Engineer presented the research findings highlighting:

- 1. Trentham's Energy Usage
- 2. The Town's Essential Sites
- 3. Opportunities for a Micro-grid
- 4. Community Battery
- 5. Large-scale Generators and
- 6. Solar Panels

#### The data showed:

- Highest power consumption came from residential usage
- 30% of the community have installed solar panels
- Energy consumption had gone up by 7-8%
- Solar export was up by 12%



It was great to hear from Matthew Nickson, TSG member and local resident, who has implemented energy-efficient practices in his home.

The data Matthew shared made us all think about what is possible. We can all start small within our households and be the change the town needs, because small changes can make a difference if these principles are implemented.

It's exciting to have the energy data available and we are in a good position to make better decisions with the information obtained from this research. # EMV June 2021 Extreme Weather Report

The findings from the Emergency Management Victoria (EMV) 'June 2021 Extreme Weather Report' were presented early in August 2022 by Commissioner Andrew Crisp. The session shared lessons learned from extensive research with local governments, agencies, departments and members of the community after the storm. EMV reported communication and having more accessible data sharing is the key to supporting communities to feel more empowered and less vulnerable.

The session highlighted:

- The loss of telecommunications caused the biggest distress for people. An independent telecommunications tower has been installed at the Trentham Library.
- 2. The importance of communicating the degrees of weather severity across multiple networks and channels that are easily accessible so that people can plan and act quickly.
  - A clear and single message (visual cue) like the 'code red' on a high fire danger day.
  - A central radio station (an auditory cue) with hourly news updates that could be listened to on the car radio.

Hopefully, other regional towns will share the same enthusiasm for this event and make it a success in their towns. As a Community Bank, sharing ideas across the network is our model for success, so a big thanks also goes to Warrnambool Community Bank which initiated the idea during the Covid19 pandemic.
