

Chair's update.

As 2015 drew to a close we saw some changes on our Board and in the branch. At our Annual General Meeting (AGM) in November, Andrew Tipple stepped down as a Director and Judy Kulisa was welcomed onto the Board.

Many of you would already know Judy from her activities as a Councillor for the Dandaragan Shire, her involvement with the Jurien Progress Association and Inspirational Community Arts Network, to name just a couple of her community interests.

I would like to thank Andrew for his assistance over the last two years. He provided some valuable insights with his knowledge of sales and marketing and also took on the Treasurer's role for a while.

Since the AGM we have appointed Peter English to the Board. Peter is a senior staff member with Bendigo and Adelaide Bank and has a comprehensive understanding of the **Community Bank**[®] model and how it works. He has taken on the role of Company Treasurer.

In the branch we were without a Manager for over six months as it took us longer than expected to find the right person for the job. So in December I was very pleased to welcome our new Branch Manager Gill Wheatley to the team. She joins Wendy, Mandy and Michelle in the branch, along with new Customer Service Officer Mel. I am confident that our branch team are willing and able to help you with all of your banking needs in a friendly and professional manner.

While the business was challenged being short staffed for the first five months of the financial year, we have recorded some growth and a small profit for the six months to 31 December 2015. Overall the branch footings (combined value of loans and deposits held at our branch) grew by \$2.1 million for a total of \$71.4 million and we broke even with a small profit of \$54.

Admittedly, this is only a very small profit and hopefully the start of bigger things to come. I believe that with our new branch team in place, the support of all of our shareholders and the wider community as customers of the branch, we will be able to start recording consistent profits, and ultimately pay a dividend to our shareholders.
