A message from the Chairman



The Bendigo Bank Community Banking model has developed into a globally unique social enterprise network in design, scale and impact! East Malvern Community Financial Services (EMCFS) is very much a part of that story for which everyone connected should feel immensely proud.

Community Bank Malvern East was one of the first Community Banks to set up in a metro environment and over the last 25 years there have been 20 directors / company secretaries and 9 branch managers. Together these individuals supported by great branch teams have helped to shape this most unique local banking model to build it into a fantastic social enterprise that rewards all stakeholders, not just the owners of capital.

Since 6th May 2000, EMCFS has set the scene for what a modern social enterprise can achieve. Apart from returning capital (over \$2m in dividends) and valuable banking services to our community. \$6m has been distributed by way of sponsorships and grants to more than 180 community partners over the last 25 years. EMCFS has transformed from humble and uncertain beginnings into a strong mature social enterprise that owns its heartland Malvern East premises and has spread its wings to operate Community Bank branches in Wantirna and Murrumbeena, now serving over 12,500 customers.

This booklet tells only a small but important part of that story of what has been accomplished and the impact our now officially certified Social Enterprise has had across the communities in which we operate.

Our 25th anniversary is officially on the 6th May 2025, when 25 years ago our founding chairman Peter Norman OAM stood alongside the Treasurer of Australia Peter Costello to open the original East Malvern Community Bank. No one present then could have imagined where we would be today. We can only dare to dream where the next 25 years will take us.

One thing for certain is that the future of Community Banking will always be based around geographic proximity to the customers and communities we serve. New digital tools will come and go, but at its core physical branches will remain central to the ethos and purpose of Community Banking for the foreseeable future. So EMCFS will continue to invest in our people, in our branches and in the communities we serve. In doing so, this social enterprise will set growth ambitions well beyond what has already been achieved.

The Community Bank model has well and truly moved from concept to one of the world's biggest social enterprises that returns not only banking services to the community but also significant community investment.

East Malvern Community Financial Services is forever part of that history and looks forward to an even brighter future!

More recently, Community Bank Malvern East has helped us bring to life our Community Garden Project. With funding for tools, plants, and essential materials, we've begun transforming our outdoor space into a thriving green hub. The first stage empowered Inclusion Melbourne's weekly garden club to get their hands dirty and connect with nature, while learning and sharing along the way. Looking ahead, we plan to grow this space into a broader community garden and kitchen program—promoting sustainability, health, and togetherness.





The ripple effect of these projects is hard to quantify. They build friendships, ignite new initiatives, and leave lasting impacts on the lives of those who walk through our doors. The support goes far beyond funding—it nurtures connection, growth, and the spirit of community that makes places like Phoenix Park Neighbourhood House flourish.

MAD Foundation

At the heart of the MAD Foundation is a simple yet powerful mission: to improve the lives of children and young people living with disabilities. Through our partnership with Community Bank Malvern East, Murrumbeena and Wantirna we have been able to provide life-changing mobility and support equipment to families facing significant hardship—transforming daily life and opening doors to new possibilities.

Thanks to this generous support, children like Georgia and Paolo have gained access to essential mobility aids that would have otherwise been out of reach. Georgia, a joyful two-year-old with Cerebral Palsy, now moves confidently with her Crocodile walker, enhancing her independence and motor skills. Her custom Juni chair allows her to engage comfortably in everyday activities, ensuring she can participate fully in family life. Meanwhile, Paolo, who has endured an extended hospital stay due to complex medical needs, has been





given the freedom to explore beyond the hospital walls for the first time with his specialist Bingo stroller—creating cherished moments with his loved ones.

These stories are a testament to the profound impact of this partnership. The support of Community Bank Malvern East does more than provide equipment; it gives children the opportunity to experience the world in ways they never thought possible. On behalf of the families we assist, we extend our deepest gratitude for making a lasting difference—one step, one smile, and one life-changing moment at a time.

This year's event supported the South Port Community Housing Group, which provides affordable housing and vital support services to help individuals experiencing homelessness rebuild their lives.

Outer East Foodshare



At Outer East Foodshare, our mission is simple but powerful: to get good food to those who need it most. Since July 2024, we've rescued over 21,000 kilograms of fresh fruit and vegetables, distributing them to more than 40 charities across Melbourne's Outer East.

As a completely volunteer-run organisation, this work wouldn't be possible without the generous support of partners like Community Bank Wantirna. Their funding and encouragement help us cover essential logistics—from rescuing surplus food to sorting and delivering it each week.


