

Making waves in the community

Across the Fleurieu, sport continues to play a vital role in connecting communities, and for Great Southern Swimming Club, that connection runs deep.

With around 100 members aged 8 to 16, the club isn't just a place to train, it's a place to belong. Assistant Coach Emma Rogers says the club is proud of its mix of



abilities; from swimmers heading to Nationals to those finding their rhythm. "Our focus is on building confidence and keeping kids in the water," she explains.

The community support provided by Community Bank Fleurieu contributes to keeping their membership fees affordable. A recent investment from the Bank helped fund essential items, including a new laptop, a 3x3 gazebo for competitions, and club-branded banners. "Without that funding, we'd have to put fees up," Emma says. "And we know that would force some families to step back." Instead, Community Bank Fleurieu's contribution has allowed the club to remain accessible, ensuring more children across the region can stay active and connected through swimming.

The benefits stretch well beyond the pool. With swimmers travelling from Victor Harbor, Willunga and McLaren Vale, the club has become a central hub for families across the region. "We're like a big family," Emma says. "Swimming brings people together, and it's amazing to see friendships form both in and out of the water."

Investing in grassroots sport is essential to building strong communities. Community Bank Fleurieu proudly returns 80% of its profits to the local region — support that makes a real difference. For clubs like the Great Southern Swimming Club, it means more kids have the opportunity to dive into something meaningful.

Bec Elliott on growth, people and a purposeful role

Backing the Volunteers Who Back Us (CFS)

On 2 May 2023, Community Bank Fleurieu proudly hosted a special Community Investment Night at Vale Restaurant and Bar, bringing together representatives from across Region 1 of the South Australian Country Fire Service (CFS) — including the Adelaide Hills, Fleurieu Peninsula, and Kangaroo Island.



The evening brought together

41 brigades from seven CFS Groups for a powerful celebration of the people who show up when it matters most.

Each brigade received a \$500 donation, and a further \$58,000 was invested into ten CFS-led projects - workshopped and proposed by the brigades themselves. In total, \$88,000 was committed to the CFS that night.

Like many community investments, the full impact wasn't immediate.

Since then, those funds have continued to translate into meaningful, practical outcomes. One example is the Mawson Group, where 90 volunteers have now been trained in first-aid, advanced resuscitation, and certified chainsaw handling. That's 90 local responders better equipped to act safely and effectively when emergencies strike.

These are the kinds of outcomes we're proud to support; investing in the vital work that happens behind the scenes, so our volunteers can continue to serve the community with confidence and care.

Mawson Group Officer, Peter Venning, recently presented our Board with a certificate of appreciation - a gesture that speaks volumes. We're honoured to stand behind those who protect our region and look forward to continuing this important partnership into the future.
