## Ole! The Spanish Festival returns to Heathcote

After the success of the 2012 El Rocio Spanish Festival in Heathcote organisers have plans well underway for its return in 2013.

Inspired by a centuries-old pilgrimage in southern Spain, the El Rocio Spanish Festival aims to promote harmony between different traditions, as well as celebrate the rich and colorful Spanish culture.

Organiser Peter Llan, from Hermandad Rociera de Victoria, said Heathcote was originally chosen as it was close to Melbourne, but also because the local community was open and enthusiastic about hosting the festival. "The countryside also reminds us of Spain where the original pilgrimage takes place," he said.

The festival begins on March 15, and is expected to attract several hundred people, but there will be a number of lead-up events held in Heathcote as well.

Keen to establish a long-term relationship with the district, the organisers are using local businesses where possible to supply goods, services and accommodation for the festival, and are promoting the region on their website.

Heathcote & District **Community Bank®** Branch is helping to sponsor bus transport during the festival, supporting Hermandad Rociera de Victoria not only to aid businesses in the region, but also recognising the role the festival will play in adding interest and diversity to the region's calendar. ## Feeding our primary school kids – Breakfast Program

Heathcote & District **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> Branch has been working with the Heathcote Primary School and Holy Rosary Primary School as well as Tooborac Primary School to bring the Kickstart Breakfast Program to the district. Heathcote & District Financial Services Limited Board member and former Holy Rosary student Hannah McCarthy has been the driving force behind this initiative, which will provide a healthy and nutritious breakfast to a number of school children.

The program aims to take some pressure off local hard-working families. Heathcote Primary School Principal Cindi Bruechert said she expected the program would mean a lot to many district families.

Liz Tobin from Holy Rosary Primary School said her school would initially be running the program two mornings per week, and anticipated student engagement would improve as a result. "A breakfast club will enable us to work with parents and the wider community to provide nourishing meals, as well as provide opportunities for social interaction in an informal environment," she said.

Ms Tobin said Holy Rosary had been looking at implementing the program for a while before Heathcote & District **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> Branch became involved, but at a reduced capacity due to funding limitations. "Without the funding from the **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> branch we probably would be only looking at running it once a week or fortnight."

## Investing in our community – the year in numbers

In October Heathcote & District **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> Branch presented \$42,000 in grants to nine community organisations at its annual Community Grants presentation night. Another \$18,000 has been allocated to three local sporting clubs in sponsorship. And a further \$15,000 from the **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> branch will fund Foodbank Victoria's KickStart Breakfast Club program within our community's three local primary schools.

That's more than \$75,000 being poured back into our region this year.

### The 2012 Community Grant recipients

**Heathcote Christmas Pageant** – Grant assisted to transport primary school children from nearby communities of Tooborac and Pyalong to join Heathcote Primary Students in the Christmas Pageant and community celebration.

**Mt Camel CFA** – Plan to extend existing CFA facilities to securely house all of the local brigade's equipment.

**Heathcote Uniting Church** – Grant will assist with the research and publishing of a book about the local district and families.

**Heathcote Showgrounds** – Funds will be used to upgrade roads and access paths for people with disabilities and families with strollers to ensure they can safely and securely access the Heathcote showgrounds.

**Anglican Church Op Shop** – Upgrade current facilities for the community shop.

**Spanish Association of Melbourne** – Expand the annual three day Spanish festival in Heathcote. The Association currently transports 200 Spanish Association members to Heathcote for the three day festival.

**Coast Guard** – Will use funds to purchase thermal imaging equipment for search and rescue activities on Lake Eppalock and other local waterways.

**H&H Music** (pictured right) – Will use funds for a music program bringing internationally acclaimed artists to our local primary schools.

“**Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> branches across Australia have provided the essential seed funding for projects including medical clinics, sporting complexes, swimming pools and even helipads – so we really have an opportunity to think big!”

## Axedale Preschool – Storage issues shelved

Faced with a pressing storage problem, Axedale Preschool successfully applied for a grant from Heathcote & District **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> Branch to construct some shelving.

Axedale Preschool committee member Ange Sisk-Kealy said the early childhood educators could now spend more time with the children, rather than scrambling through equipment to find what they need.

## Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program

The program at Heathcote Primary School is well underway, with garden and kitchen classes already commenced. The program has received the support of over 25 businesses and individuals including Heathcote & District Community Bank® Branch which helped to purchase 32 chairs for the new dining area.

"At the end of every kitchen session, the students will sit around the tables on these smart-looking chairs to share a meal containing the produce they have lovingly grown, harvested and prepared together," Heathcote Primary Principal Cindi Bruechert said.

"Without the generous support of the Community Bank® branch we would not have been able to purchase these new chairs, and we would probably have had to make do with carrying in chairs from the other classrooms each time we ran the kitchen class."

Students have reacted with excitement and enthusiasm to the program – not only are they involved in growing the vegetables, which includes such tasks as composting, planting, watering and weeding, but they also get to taste the fruits of their labour, experiencing the process from spade to blade! Below is a recipe for Chow Mein, which the students prepared recently mainly using ingredients sourced from their very own school garden.



### Chow Mein

#### Ingredients

Vegetables from our Garden including:

Bok Choy	Broccoli
Broccolini	Chinese Cabbage
Spring Onions	Zucchini
Celery	Carrots

500grams Minced Steak

1 clove Garlic

2 teaspoons Curry Powder

2 cups Water

1 packet Chicken Noodle Soup Mix

1 packet Chow Mein Noodles

Soy sauce

Salt and pepper



#### Method

Grate carrots then chop all other vegetables. Brown minced steak and garlic in fry pan.

Add vegetables, and curry powder. Once the vegetables have cooked down, add water, chicken noodle soup and chow mein noodles. Cook for 10 to 15 minutes. Add soy sauce, salt and pepper to taste.
