worthy projects. The support of the many customers of the East Ivanhoe **Community Bank**[®] Branch is making a big difference at a local level. Here are some of the key projects you are helping to support:

• Banyule Support and Information Centre: This community based volunteer organisation provides information, support and referral services to the local community. The Community Bank® branch's funding

will assist with the centre's emergency relief program to purchase food vouchers and other essential items.

- Ist Ivanhoe Sea Scouts: Sea Scouts provides youth mentoring and leadership skills, through participation and water activities. The funding provided will be used for the purchase of much needed new canoe trailers for many of their activities.
- Children's Protection Society: This is an independent children's welfare organisation which provides valuable services to families and vulnerable children. Your Community Bank[®] branches have provided funding to build storage units for children's toys, games and sporting equipment.
- Catholic Parish of Ivanhoe Outreach Wellbeing Centre: This Centre has been operating for 15 months to enable youth, men and other groups to stay connected to the community. The funding provided is to upgrade their hall facilities inlcluding carpet, storage, billiard and table tennis facilities, electrical and AV equipment.
- **Banksia Palliative Care Service:** Established in 1993, Banksia now works with over 500 clients who have terminal illness. The funding will support a learning centre in Lower Heidelberg Road to help bereaved families.

- Macleod Recreation Centre YMCA: The Centre effectively engages youth to run events and activities for their own age bracket. Your Community Bank® branches have contributed funding for resources for young people to organise and present drug and alcohol free music and dance events across Banyule over the 09/10 summer holiday period.
- Banyule Housing Support Group: This not for profit organisation provide critical services for the homeless and pending homeless within Banyule. Your Community Bank[®] branches have provided funding for whitegoods, medical, dental and optical needs.
- **Ivanhoe Diamond Valley Centre:** This group work with people with disabilities and involvement in the Variety Bash car rally has given a great opportunity for their clients to actively participate. Funding received for an upgrade to their CarWorx garage where clients work on the cars for the rally.



- Chris Roberts and Adam Schickerling from the Ivanhoe Dimaond Valley Centre receive their grant which will fund an upgrade to their Carworx garage.
- **East Ivanhoe Neighbourhood Watch:** This well established group provides safety advice and support in an effort to curb crime in the local area. The funding provided will cover costs for newsletters and other ongoing expenses throughout the year.
- Banyule Toy Library: As part of a larger rejuvenation project resulting in the purchase of over 200 new toys, this additional funding will provide new shelving to accommodate new toys purchased.
- East Ivanhoe Preschool: Continuing on from a broader upgrade project to the



outdoor facilities, your **Community Bank**[®] branches have provided funding for a landscape architect to to provide a landscape and playspace design for the new kindergarten playspace.

- **Olympic Adult Education:** OAE provides an opportunity for residents to access learning in various forms. Funding was provided to purchase a data projector and teaching and learning resources for use across their adult education programs.
- Heidelberg Historical Society: This volunteer based organisation helps preserve records and objects of historical significance to the area. Your Community Bank® branches have provided funding for the purchase of new computers and server equipment contributing to the society's computerised collection project.
- **Ivanhoe Children's Community Cooperative:** Providing kinder spaces for 37 local kids and day care for 94, this cooperative were provided funds for an upgrade of their outdoor play equipment.
- **Livingstone Community Centre:** This centre helps more than 650 per week in a range of community activities. Funding is to enhance the facilities with two baby change stations, safe hot water unit and laptop computers.
- North East Radio Centre: Members of this amateur radio club provide emergency communication and assist charitable organisations. The funding will be used to install an Amatuer Radio Tower and antenna at the clubrooms to enable better club activities and to enhance emergency response capabilities.
- Ivanhoe Photographic Society: The IPS have an active membership of photographers who assist with the photography of many local activities. The funding will be used to overhaul the club's current facilities with an overhead projector, high definition audio/visual technology and computer equipment compatible with digital images.
- **Fairy Hills Kindergarten:** This local kinder runs 3 and 4 year old kinder sessions for 90 local families. The funding contribution towards the purchase and installation of smart grass in the children's playground.

SPX Waterdale Players: This group of talented young performers have already engaged 300 people, to enable youth to become future community leaders. Funding will be used to co-fund their "Musical Youth Development Project", designed to encourage youth to explore creative outlets as a means of positive self-expression and self esteem development.
