Giving back to the community

The East Ivanhoe & Heidelberg **Community Bank**[®] branches continue to grow the tally of community contributions, with an additional \$77,000 distributed at the Grants event in September. This brings the overall community contribution to more than \$1.2 million since the branch first opened its doors in May 2001.

The grants presentation event coincided with the Heidelberg **Community Bank**[®] Branch first birthday celebrations. Senior Manager Noel Donnelly has been thrilled by the community support of the branch to date. "In one year the branch has already secured over \$45 million in local banking business. As this figure grows, so too will the amount we can contribute to the community," he said. "The more customers we have, the more we have to distribute back to community groups and projects. It is an exciting time for both the **Community Bank**[®] branch and our local residents".

The September grants event was attended by many of the grant recipients who were delighted to receive their cheques and share stories of their exciting and worthy projects. Here are some of the key projects that your local **Community Bank**[®] branch is supporting:

- **Olympic Adult Education:** Offering a broad range of learning opportunities to locals, OAE are well utilised by the community and tackle a number of issues in the area including literacy and English as a second language. Funding was provided to replace six computers for adult learning.
- **SPX Waterdale Players:** This group of talented young performers work with abroad cross section of local youth to become engaged in community through arts performances and programs. Engaging over 90 individuals, funding will see the continuation of the "Musical Youth Development Project", designed to encourage youth to explore creative outlets as a means of positive self-expression and self esteem development.
- **Banyule Housing Support Group:** This not for profit organisation provides housing solutions for community members in crisis who are at risk or are homeless. Funding is being used to furnish three units to be used for transitional housing.
- **Volunteers of Banyule:** This is a great service that coordinates community volunteers and the organisations

that need assistance. Funding has been provided to upgrade their website which should attract more people to the program, providing Banyule with a larger pool of willing volunteers.

- **St James Anglican Church Ivanhoe:** Funding was provided to upgrade their kitchen facilities to assist with community events and enable more groups to use the church facilities.
- **Heidelberg Historical Society:** This volunteer based organisation helps preserve records and objects of historical significance to the Heidelberg region. Your **Community Bank**[®] branch has provided funding to purchase new equipment to assist in digitising the records for future generations to easily access the information.
- **Diamond Valley Prostate Cancer Support Group:** This group supports men with prostate cancer, providing a support network as well as events where facilitators provide health information. Funding has been provided to support these events.
- **St Andrews Playgroups Rosanna:** Playgroups enhance the social, motor and developmental skills of participating children. Funding was provided to this playgroup to purchase an outside play structure with a slide and will benefit over 100 children who use the facility.
- **Austin Health:** The child care centre at Austin Health has 70 children attending each day. To enhance and promote outdoor play, funding has been provided to purchase and install a shade sail to provide protection from the weather elements.

- **Inner North East Community Radio:** The community radio station provides local residents with a local station offering listeners information on the local area, groups, what's on and also provides services in other languages. Funding was provided to upgrade the kitchen facilities as the volunteers who work at the station need access to hot running water.

- **Banyule Community Health:** A group of Koori men that attend the Men's Shed program have initiated an arts based gallery aimed at improving their health and the health of their community. Funding has been provided to buy resources for the gallery.

- **Open House Christian Involvement Centres:** The Backyard Sports program provides weekly activities for youth who promote mentoring, self esteem and a sense of community. It assists in developing support networks for the disadvantaged, and your **Community Bank**[®] branch is pleased to continue to provide funding for this very worthy cause.

- **Banksia Palliative Care Service:** Established in 1993, Banksia now works with more than 500 clients who have terminal illness. BPCS helps people with progressive terminal illness through a program that provides a journal worker to compile biographies of clients. Funding has been provided to train volunteers to participate in the program.

- **2nd Ivanhoe Scout group:** The Scout Hall is the base for scouting and community activities. Funding will be used to upgrade the kitchen to enable OHS standards are met and to encourage further community use.

- **Rosanna Scout Group:** De Winton Park Hall has been home to the scouts since 1999. The building is in desperate need of repair and we are funding the repairs to the damaged roof and to provide insulation.

- **The Advisory Council for Children with Impaired Hearing:** This organisation provides support for children with hearing loss and their families with programs and services to ensure full inclusion into mainstream education and community. The funding will be used buy resources to support parents with everyday issues they face.

- **Banyule Support and Information Centre:** This community based volunteer organisation provides information, support and referral services to the disadvantaged within the local community. The **Community Bank**[®] branch funding will purchase materials to be distributed to the community about the services available.

- **Heidelberg Occasional Care Child Care Centre:** This group provides occasional care for kids aged 6 months to 6 years. To provide a welcoming and stimulating environment, and to promote engagement across cultures, they will use the funding provided to build a sensory garden for play and socialisation, and purchase more multicultural resources.

- **Alphington Bowls Club:** This BBQ area at this bowling club is used by a range of community groups. Funding has been granted to construct a shelter over the BBQ to build community capacity and strength.
