Two million reasons to celebrate!

East Ivanhoe and Heidelberg Community Bank® branches have hit a major milestone, returning more than more than \$2 million in banking profits back to the East Ivanhoe, Alphington, Ivanhoe, Heidelberg, West Heidelberg, Rosanna, Macleod and Viewbank communities.

Sam Pearce, Senior Branch Manager said that supporting the local community through sponsorships and grants was the backbone of the Community Bank® model.

Defib Your Club for Life

The Board of East Ivanhoe and Heidelberg **Community Bank®** branches

has committed \$50,000 for the supply and installation of 20 automatic defibrillators to community clubs and organisations throughout our local community.



This exciting project will see clubs, businesses, schools and kindergartens apply for and receive potentially life-saving automatic defibrillators, as well as training – for their club.

Defib Your Club for Life was formed in memory of 19 year old Stephen Buckman, a young Rupertswood footballer who collapsed and died during training in May 2010. Sadly, his death has not been the only one in these circumstances and the charity was established by MICA paramedic Andrew White who, while off duty, tried to save the life of Stephen, found that without timely access to a defibrillator he was unable to revive him. East Ivanhoe and Heidelberg **Community Bank®** branches are now offering 20 clubs the opportunity to access an automatic defibrillator to potentially save lives.

This piece of equipment is the most important piece of equipment that any club or group can have. Anywhere that large groups gather, benefits for access to automatic defibrillators for use in emergency situations, for example football and cricket grounds, netball and basketball stadiums, bowling clubs, shopping strips and other organisations.

One in 1,000 people have an underlying cardiac condition that they are unaware of and for every one minute that elapses after the collapse, the chance of survival falls by 10%.

Each unit is registered with the “000” help number and its location, and importantly callers will be advised of this in an emergency. Representatives from successful club will receive comprehensive training in how to use the machines.

Twenty automatic defibrillators will be given to various community groups across Heidelberg, Heidelberg West, Macleod, Rosanna, Viewbank, Ivanhoe, East Ivanhoe, Eaglemont and Alphington.

The local Defib Your Club for Life project is one of many major initiatives to be made possible by the customers of East Ivanhoe and Heidelberg **Community Bank®** branches. These two branches alone have now contributed over \$2 million back to the community, and the more banking business that comes through these two branches, the more funds raised, and more major projects like this can be funded.

Open House

As part of a five year sponsorship, East Ivanhoe and Heidelberg **Community Bank**[®] branches have funded the purchase of a ute for use by Open House. The ute is used in the youth workshop mentoring program, a program for young men who are having problems in years 7 – 9 at school, at home or who have come to the attention of the police. They receive one-to-one support for one day per week during the school term, in a workshop environment. Applicants, in conjunction with their parents/guardians and the school, discuss the particular situation and plan strategies to assist the young man. It is of course, subject to the desire of the young person to make positive changes to his life. Workshops are conducted on billy-karts, go-karts and bicycles as required.

Banyule Volunteer Awards

As many of the community groups that we work with are made up of armies of local volunteers, it was fitting East Ivanhoe and Heidelberg **Community Bank**[®] branches were the sponsor of the Community Group of the Year Award for 2012, as part of the Banyule Volunteer Awards. The category was well contested with four groups awarded Highly Commended – Banyule Art Collection Advisory Committee, Neighbourhood Watch, Transition 3081, and Words with Wheels.

However there can only be one winner, and it was awarded to Austin Health volunteer driver service.

For 52 years, Austin Health's volunteer drivers have been ensuring patients who have no other means of transport can get to their medical appointments. In the past year alone, the volunteer drivers have made more than 2,550 trips and have clocked up more than 75,000 kilometres and made more than 2,542 calls to patients to confirm transport arrangements. Volunteer drivers collect patients from their home, take them to their appointments, and either wait with them or transport others until they are notified the patient is ready to go home.

The drivers are dedicated and very community focused providing not only transport, but emotional and physical support as well. They understand what is going on in patients' lives beyond the hospital visit, and go out of their way to ensure that the patient is looked after from A to B. The drivers put an enormous amount of effort into ensuring the journey is pleasant and supportive.
