The Yerong Creek hall was condemned and closed in 2004 leaving the Yerong Creek community without a public hall. At a town meeting

in 2004 it was resolved that the hall committee and the Yerong Creek Bowling Club jointly pursue a community hall being built adjacent to the Club.

Since that time applications were made to both the Regional Solutions and Regional Partnership programmes without success. In the meantime the community continued to work towards this project by fundraising and completing stage one of the project. Stage one included the toilets and storage area which would be used by the Club and the Hall plus meeting room and shower and toilet which can be used by people playing sport at the recreation ground. This was achieved with grants from ClubBiz of \$18,000

and Department of Sport & Rec of \$5,000, club funds of over \$81,000 and sponsorships from Henty Community Financial Services (Henty Community Bank® Branch Community) of \$5,000; and Les and Mary Dale of \$1,000 plus over 3,000 hours of voluntary labour.

Now building of the new hall has commenced due to the combined assistance of funds raised by the community (\$110,000), grants received from the Federal Government (\$285,000), and Lockhart Shire Council (\$62,000.00 plus a loan of \$50,000) and the Henty Community Financial Services (\$18,000 plus repaying loan of \$50,000 to LSC). Country Energy has also assisted with upgrading the town's transformer.

The new hall will be able to be used either separately from the club, provided alcohol is not being consumed, or in conjunction with the Club and its liquor licence.

When the Yerong Creek Hall was demolished the community was left with no hall to hold events such as the annual school presentation night, larger events such as dinners and weddings. The Club had to hire, at considerable expense, a marquee to hold a dinner to celebrate the 125th anniversary of the school. The building of this new facility will greatly enhance the small but vibrant community that is Yerong Creek.
