Community Funding Night.

Held in Feb 2017, the five Logan branches hosted their Annual Community Funding Night at River Lakes Golf Club and Tavern. One of the recipients Amputees and Families Support Group Qld Inc is a network of amputees, their families and carers with firsthand experience of the effects of amputation; wanting to support and encourage other amputees from pre-amputation through to rehabilitation and beyond. The group was started in 1986 by a dedicated band of amputees who felt alone and isolated when they first lost their limb(s) and were trying to accept and integrate the changes into their personal, professional and recreational lives.

On Saturday 1 July 2017, the Amputees and Families Support Group Qld Inc set



out to raise money to buy new wheelchairs by walking in the Star 5.7km Challenge at the 2017 Gold Coast Marathon. Springwood **Community Bank®** Branch Manager, Linda Ambrose participated in the walk and assisted throughout the event. A great morning was had walking, running and wheeling their way along the course.
