
Chairman's update

It's an extremely busy time for our Company Mansfield & District Community Enterprises Ltd ('the Company'), as we finalise the audit of the end of financial year accounts, celebrate our 4th birthday, and prepare the Annual Report and Annual General Meeting.

We have finalised the update of our shareholder register – if you have not done so, please complete and return the form we sent out to you as a matter of urgency. If we do not have your correct details we cannot contact you. Where possible we will contact you electronically, saving considerable time and money in printing costs.

The marketing committee has been committed over the past six months to assessing the many requests for funds for projects you believe will strengthen our community. Wherever possible we have assisted with these projects and some of these you will see throughout this newsletter.

The **Community Bank**[®] concept is a very simple one – often so simple that many people keep looking for 'the catch'. Banking with the Mansfield & District **Community Bank**[®] Branch generates profit – the Company constitution decrees that 20 percent of the net profit can be returned to the shareholders in the form of dividends, 80 percent is returned to the community through grants and sponsorships. We simply cannot support community projects without your commitment to bank with the bank you own.



As you see from this chart less than 50 percent of shareholders have all their accounts with our **Community Bank**[®] branch, 40 percent of shareholders – the people who own the bank – don't bank with the **Community Bank**[®] branch at all. I would ask you to consider the implications of these percentages – think what we could achieve if you were banking at your **Community Bank**[®] branch.

Your Directors have continued to engage in professional development throughout the past six months. In May Paul Sladdin and I attended the Tas/Vic **Community Bank**[®] State Conference on the Mornington Peninsula and from this we are currently developing a 'sister relationship' with the Ivanhoe/ East Heidelberg **Community Bank**[®] Branch as a way of strengthening our business and sharing knowledge with a metropolitan branch.

In June I facilitated the North East regional Chairman's meeting at Wangaratta attended by Nathalia, Bright, Mount Beauty, Beechworth and Mansfield. Also attending was Vicki Pearce, Bendigo Bank Victorian State Manager, our new Regional Manager Mark Brown and two other Bendigo Bank representatives. These meetings are now set for three per year and will focus on North East Victoria's capacity to market and grow the region's **Community Bank**[®] branches.

In August Directors attended a half day workshop focused on risk management and understanding changes to the profit share between Bendigo Bank and the Company.

L2P learner driver mentor program

NESAY (North East Support and Action for Youth Inc.), Mansfield Toyota, Mansfield Shire and the **Community Bank**[®] branch have partnered to provide a vehicle, including all running costs, to enable young Mansfield residents to achieve the required driving hours to qualify for their driving permit.


