Community Investment program

Our Board is keen to fund professional master plans for recreation reserves and other community organisations. A master plan that is adopted by the stakeholders including the local shire is a great way to maximise the funds we can grant to a project and attract other funds from other levels of government.

A master plan is a long-term plan that provides a vision and framework for how an area can grow and develop. When a master plan is being developed there is a great deal of community consultation to ensure the facilities provide services to the broader community, encouraging the committee of management to explore new opportunities to be held at their venue. These plans provide certainty for both the group committee and its community members about what change is expected in an area. The consultation assists them to respond to matters including but not limited to; the recreational uses for ovals, playgrounds, walking/bike tracks, BBQ areas with shelters, skateparks etc and to plan the development of parking spaces, building designs, heritage/character and other open spaces. A number of our local football clubs have worked with their ground's recreation reserve committees to come up with some great plans. Currently the Ballan Recreation Reserve Committee of Management is working with all user groups to renovate and reinvigorate their area.
