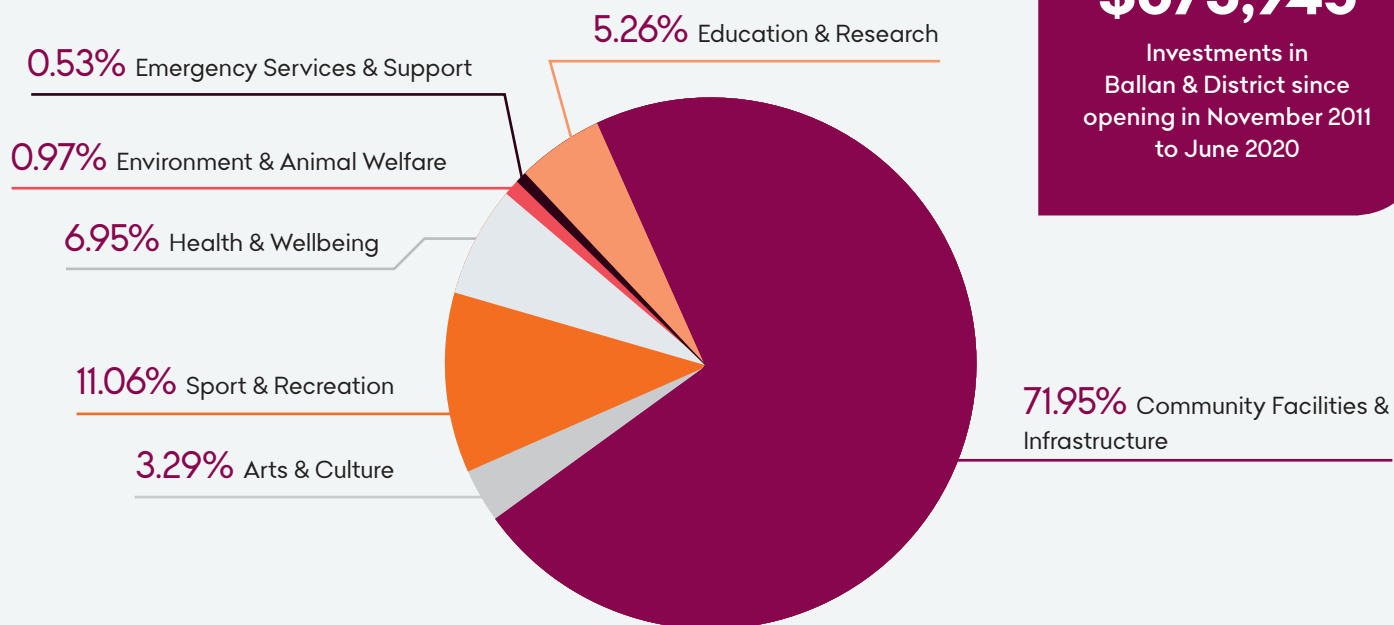

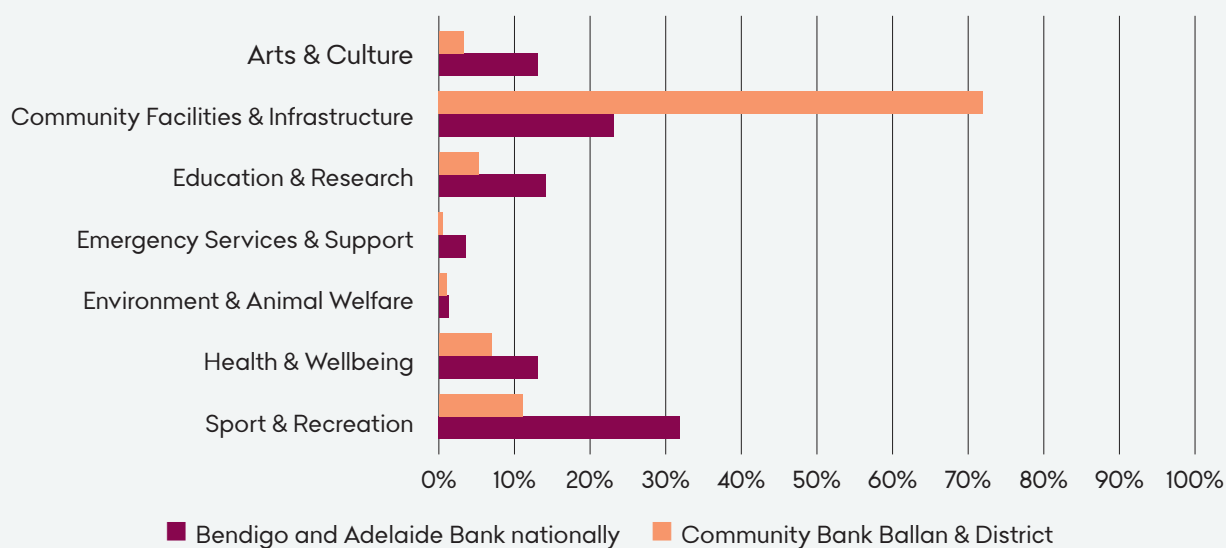

Fiona Elsey Cancer Research Institute



In a Community Bank collaboration, Community Bank Ballan & District, along with Buninyong, Creswick and Beaufort branches have donated a combined total of \$110,000 for the expansion of its tissue bank for what is now called 'The Bendigo Bank Tissue Bank' at the Fiona Elsey Cancer Research Institute (FECRI).

The Bendigo Bank Tissue Bank houses nearly 4,500 patient samples - many from cancer patients as well as healthy samples that are vital to researchers work. This has seen significant growth in recent years with the development of the research program and profile of the Ballarat laboratory. In the last year biobank samples have increased by 52% on the previous year.

FECRI is located in Ballarat and is a community funded program and the only cancer research institute in regional Australia.

Key projects being undertaken at the Institute include:

- Ovarian cancer
- Breast cancer
- Chronic lymphocytic leukaemia
- Histiocytic disorders
- Bowel cancer
- Renal cancer
- Immune studies into the biology of various cancer and leukaemia's.
