Branch Manager's report.



Having opened our doors for business on 24 May 2002 we have just ticked off our 15th birthday. I believe this gives reason to pause, look back and reflect on what has been an amazing period of time for our Bank.

Mooroolbark **Community Bank**® Branch was opened a day earlier

on 23 May 2002 by the late Peter Brock. I still clearly remember standing on the terrace area in front of the branch addressing the people below at our official Opening Ceremony. At that time I only knew a handful of people in the crowd and really had little insight as to what the next 15 years would bring. I guess at that stage I was just hoping we would get some customers in when we opened the doors.

Before a **Community Bank**® branch can open, significant funds are raised from the sale of shares to mainly local residents. Funds raised are used to finance the new branch fit out and dwindled down over time as the first year or two will see the branch operating on monthly losses. Over time the losses plateau out and profits start to flow in. At Mooroolbark we progressed through this phase in our first four to five years. As we grew so did our ability to financially support local not for profit groups as well as pay dividends to our shareholders.

Today we support over 50 not-for-profit groups each year. We are about to tick over returning \$1.5 million via our

Sponsorship and Community Grant Programs. We have been able to do this whilst continuing to build a most viable and sustainable business. The ability to work with these groups and to support their projects over time has given me great satisfaction that I never dreamt of when I spoke at the Opening Ceremony.

On a sadder note we have had two of our founding Board members pass away. I will forever be grateful for the support I was provided by the late Peter Higgins and Jean Mitchinson. Both Peter and Jean were instrumental in getting our Bank up and going. They also had a profound effect working for other local community groups/events.

Whilst branch staff members have come and gone over this time, all leaving their own positive impact on our branch, we celebrate still having four of our original staff – myself, Julie, Rosemarie and Ann. Hopefully I don't get three staff all wanting their long service leave at the same time!

Finally, thank you to our Board of Directors, shareholders and of course our wonderful customers who have been with us throughout this 15-year journey. Thank you for your individual support for without this we would not have the success we have today or nor could we be as supportive as we are towards local community groups.

Here's to the next 15 years.
