Chipmunks By The Bay Early Learning

As Directors of Community Bank Mount Martha, Colin and Matt Forsyth are strong advocates for giving back to their community that supports local families and future generations. When they became aware that Chipmunks by the Bay Early Learning Centre was seeking funding to upgrade its outdoor play equipment and nursery high chairs, they were pleased to support a cause close to their hearts. The centre is attended by Matt's son and Colin's grandson, giving them firsthand insight into the high-quality care and nurturing environment provided by the educators.

In recognition of the dedication shown by the team and the positive impact the centre has on young children, Colin and Matt each donated \$1,000 to assist with these improvements. Their contribution supports the creation of a safe, engaging space where children can continue to learn, play, and thrive.

The donation was warmly received by Centre Director, Kathie Servetas, who expressed her appreciation for the support. Colin also had the opportunity to visit the centre on Grandparents' Day, where photos were taken of the newly installed outdoor home-corner furniture and the new wooden highchairs, which have replaced outdated plastic versions. This initiative reflects a shared belief that investing in early childhood education helps build a stronger, more connected community – starting with its youngest members who bring so much energy and promise to every day.

Peninsula Parkinson's Peer Support Group

The Peninsula Parkinson's Peer Support Group provides a supportive and inclusive environment for people living with Parkinson's disease, as well as their carers and supporters. The group is dedicated to education, wellbeing, and staying active, and meets monthly at the Mount Martha Community House. Each meeting features a guest speaker, with topics ranging from occupational therapy and physiotherapy to broader health and lifestyle support.

Earlier this year, Narelle from our branch generously contributed her \$1,000 staff donation to support the group's ongoing activities. Founding members Ken Wall and Phillip Hancome advised that part of the donation would be used to host an afternoon tea at one of their monthly meetings, recognising the important role carers play in supporting people living with Parkinson's.

Narelle was later invited to attend the afternoon tea, which featured a Halloween theme. She shared that it was a pleasure to be included in the event, enjoy a coffee and treats with members, and help raise awareness of a group that now supports more than 200 members across the Peninsula.

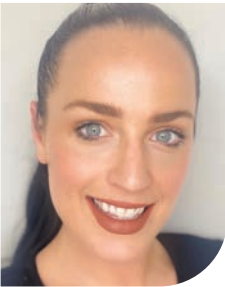
