Peninsula Home Hospice provides comprehensive palliative care to hundreds of local people every year. Their services, offered free of charge, ensure that those wanting to stay in their own home as they face a life limiting illness are able to do so.

With the support of Bendigo Bank branches, the VICSWIM program took place in January at over 200 venues across the state. Around 15,000 children took part in these low-cost swimming lessons, giving them the skills and experience to stay safe in the water.



In January, 35 young people gathered at Camp Manyung for the Bendigo Bank-Mornington Peninsula Youth Leadership Program run by the shire's Youth Services team. The program helps participants develop confidence, leadership skills and connections with community.
