It's all part of the mutually beneficial relationship that comes with a community bank.



Emergency and community support



Emergency and community support services are at the heart of our community. With pressures increasing, our funding supports local responders and organisations to provide assistance.





Our funding enables the Mt Eliza Fire Brigade and CFA subscribe to software so they can mobilise their local volunteers quickly in the event of an emergency. They work to an incredible three minute local response time, keeping people and property safe. This year we've also provided funding for them to upgrade their community call-out sign to a new digital one. This will help them advise fire safety and other community messages.





We work closely with the Rotary Club of Mt Eliza, supporting their community events like the Australia Day BBQ and the Mornington Peninsula International Womens' Day Breakfast. This year we've also provided them with funding for a new community BBQ trailer which will be used by a number of local organisations in their fundraising.

Mt Eliza Neighbourhood House is one of our major community partners. We're proud to support their community lunches, which bring people together for a low-cost nutritious meal and great company. The house has been supporting the community since 1975. It hosts a range of activities including: health, wellbeing, creative and social groups, computer literacy sessions, a men's social group and the popular community lunches.



Mornington Peninsula Support Centre volunteers prepare and pack food for hundreds of clients per week. It's an important program supporting the most vulnerable in our community. We were proud to support them this year.





Peninsula Transport Assist is our local community transport organisation. In 2022–23 their 58 volunteer drivers provided 2321 trips to 402 clients. That's a big help for a lot of people to get to appointments, shops or outings.

Peninsula Home Hospice provides comprehensive palliative care to hundreds of local people every year. Their services, offered free of charge, ensure that those wanting to stay in their own home as they face a life limiting illness can do so. We're proud to support this service as a major sponsor of their annual fundraising golf day.

Sport and recreation



Our region has a strong community sport culture. It's part of what makes it such a great place to live. Clubs provide health and wellbeing benefits to their members and bring people together for fitness, fun and competition.



Mornington Life Saving Club is an integral part of the community. Their volunteers keep thousands of people safe on Mills Beach every summer. The club also provides water safety and surf life saver training to its members and keeps them fit, healthy and active.



Our annual sponsorship helps Mt Eliza Netball Club support their young players and families. In 2023, 15 of their 17 teams made it to the finals. The great result is a testament to their fantastic club culture.





Mt Eliza Bowling Club is another of our long-term partners. We support their Community Bowls Challenge event every summer which introduces new players to lawn bowls and the club environment. This year the event hosted 26 teams from local businesses and groups, facilitating connections and networks as well as skills on the greens.



Some of the country's top sailors were out on the Bay in March competing in the Finn Class State Championships being held at Davey's Bay Yacht Club. We are proud to support the club.



The Mornington Peninsula Flyers Swim Club has bases at PARC in Frankston and YAWA in Rosebud. It is our local club for squad and competitive swimming. Their members compete at state, national and international competitions.

Baden Powell Cricket Club based at Overport Park will celebrate their club's 60th anniversary in late 2023. We're proud to be long-term supporter of the club, keeping their senior and junior members fit, healthy and connected through summer.





We're delighted to sponsor both Mt Eliza Football Netball and Mt Eliza Junior Football clubs based at Emil Madsen Reserve. The senior club keeps over 1200 football and netball players fit, healthy, active and connected through winter, while the junior club is Australia's largest, with over 800 registered junior players in 2022–23.





The Frankston Dolphins Football Netball and Junior Football clubs are based at Overport Park in Frankston South. In 2023, the senior football and netball players had a great season. Their Reserves team won the grand final. The junior club had over 500 local kids registered to play.





This year we've had the opportunity to help Baxter Soccer Club develop its junior progams. With new junior teams and a robust MiniRoos program, more local kids have the opportunity to play soccer. We also support the club's Senior Reserves team. The club is recognised as a mentally healthy organisation that supports its members and community.



This year we helped the Ranelagh Club with a set of new life vests to keep the children safe on the water during their summer KidSail program.



We helped the little Somerville Dragons basketball team register for the local competition and supplied their uniforms this year.



Mt Eliza Tennis Club in the Howard Parker Reserve has high performance coaching staff, competitions, fitness and kids activities. We are proud to support them.



Founded in 1929, Baxter Cricket Club fields senior and junior teams in the Mornington Peninsula Cricket Association. This family-friendly club has a team to suit everyone.



The 1st Ranelagh Scouts Group provides young people aged 5–25 with opportunities to grow through adventure activities. We helped them purchase equipment this year.



Mornington Soccer Club hosts 30 teams and over 500 players. It's one of the region's major player development clubs and an accredited Good Sports Club.



Somerville Junior Football Club were able to invest in new kitchen equipment and team bags this year with our help. Our support also helps them keep membership costs down for everyone.



Moorooduc Junior Football Club is a small club with a big heart. We're proud to support them and their plans to install lights at their home ground.



Mt Eliza Cricket Club is a family club that fosters cricket in the community and supports the health, fitness, wellbeing and connections of their senior, women's and junior players and their families.



Delacombe Park Cricket Club in Frankston South has a base of strong junior programs and established senior teams, including a women's group. The club environment encourages equality, participation, positive self-esteem and sportsmanship.

Walker's Road Pre School has been helping our littlest locals learn and develop for the past 43 years. Our funding will help them tackle some much-needed maintenance of their outdoor areas, supporting the staff, families and children



With our support Mt Eliza Secondary College started the school year hearing from Boonwurrung educator Jaeden about healing and connecting with country and culture



In January a group of young people gathered at Camp Manyung for the Bendigo Bank–Mornington Peninsula Youth Leadership Camp. The camp is run by the Mornington Peninsula Shire's Youth Services team.

Our regional branches have been funding this event since 2016. It's an opportunity for participants develop confidence, leadership skills and connections with the community.

The shire's Youth Advisory Committee draws its members from this group. That committee advises council and brings an important youth perspective to the shire's programs and initiatives.

The Youth Advisory Committee also host the shire's annual youth awards, recognising extraordinary young people having an impact across our region.



We supported Kunyung Pre School, helping children from around 50 local families to play, learn and grow. The staff help local kids develop a love of learning, extend their boundaries and build resilience for life.



Mornington Peninsula Toastmasters received a grant from us this year to purchase new IT equipment. That is helping them run hybrid meetings and develop skills for on-screen speaking and presentations.



Bendigo Bank supports the Victorian Government's VICSWIM program. This year around 15,000 Victorian children took part in these low-cost swimming lessons, giving them the skills and experience to stay safe in the water. We also provided the program with funding for defibrillator units to use at their regional open water venues, including a number on the Mornington Peninsula.
