Supporting VICSWIM

VICSWIM has been providing Victorian children with learn to swim programs since 1976. It is an initiative of Aquatics and Recreation Victoria and the Victorian State Government. Bendigo Bank is the official partner.

The popular program is run at pools and open water venues across Victoria in January every year. It is low cost and open to children 4–12 years of age.

In early January 2022 the VICSWIM program took place at over 200 venues across the state and around 15,000 children took part in swimming lessons. This was a great result despite some COVID disruptions at the time.

Bendigo Bank is committed to the health and wellbeing of our communities. VICSWIM is a program that not only gives children an active physical experience, it sets them up with the important life skills to keep them safe in and around the water.

Local venues in 2022 included PARC in Frankston, Dromana foreshore, Pelican Park in Hastings and YAWA in Rosebud.

In 2021, 294 Australians lost their lives by drowning. This terrible statistic has been climbing steadily for the past few years. Teaching children how to swim, float, tread water and other skills from an early age helps prevent these fatalities. Bendigo Bank is proud to be a part of that.


