## A big year of local contributions

In the 2024–25 financial year, Our Community Company (OCC) returned a huge \$491,254 to our region through our Community Investment Program. Since opening our first branch, OCC has reinvested almost \$15 million into local clubs, schools, community groups, and essential services—a milestone that reflects the power of community banking.

We have supported our communities with the Community Bank model for over 26 years in partnership with Bendigo Bank. From a single branch, we have grown to operate six—all united by one purpose: to strengthen the communities we serve.

## Investment highlights for 2025

### Bunyip – \$92,675 returned locally

Funding supported a wide range of local sports clubs, including cricket, football, netball, soccer, golf, and pony clubs, helping create safe and inclusive environments for young people. Schools and kindergartens received support for educational programs, while Moy-Yan Neighbourhood House benefited from funding for its Weld Like a Girl workshops. Local CFA brigades were also supported to continue their vital emergency services.

### Koo Wee Rup – \$73,905 returned locally

Education and wellbeing were areas of focus, with Cardinia Primary School receiving a classroom TV to enhance learning, and Koo Wee Rup Secondary College supported through the PAWsitivity assisted animal therapy program. Sporting clubs benefited from facility upgrades, while community safety and inclusion were strengthened through support for the Fire Brigade and an Indigenous space at the Community Garden.

### Lang Lang – \$133,000 returned locally

Investments supported sports and recreation clubs, seniors groups, and community facilities. Key projects included upgraded toilets at the Lang Lang Showgrounds and solar panel installation at the Community Centre, improving accessibility, sustainability, and long-term cost savings. These projects help ensure Lang Lang remains a welcoming place for events and community connection.

### Narre Warren South – \$81,000 returned locally

Funding supported creative learning at Narre Warren North Kindergarten, women's wellbeing initiatives, community events such as local carols, and the Isabella & Marcus Foundation—supporting childhood brain cancer research. A major highlight was funding toward the Narre Warren Fire Brigade's new catering unit truck, providing critical support to emergency responders during incidents across multiple agencies.

## Pearcedale – \$55,608 returned locally

Safety and inclusion were prioritised, with funding for a thermal imaging camera for the Pearcedale CFA, improving firefighter and community safety. Local sporting clubs also received funding to make their activities accessible for everyone.

## Tooradin & Coastal Villages – \$55,065 returned locally

Funding supported community transport services, sporting and pony clubs, and vital CFA infrastructure upgrades. Key projects included a portable power station for Warneet Blind Bight CFA and a PPE decontamination laundry facility for Tooradin CFA, improving emergency response capability and firefighter health across the region.

Additional funding supported mental health programs in schools, sport-based wellbeing initiatives, and the installation of life-saving defibrillators.

## We'll continue to invest locally

Our branches will reopen the Community Investment Program in February 2026, and organisations are encouraged to contact their nearest branch to discuss funding opportunities.
