

Community Funding Partnership.

The 2017/18 round of our Community Funding Partnership program will be launched on 1 June at the Gippsland Lakes Yacht Club.

We invite local community organisations to submit applications for funding for local projects, activities and events that will help benefit the community and the Paynesville & District **Community Bank**[®] Branch.

Community forum.

In November, we hosted a community forum, attended by about 45 local people, where we worked through what we could do to improve, empower, strengthen, connect, and support our community in the future. Mayor of East Gippsland Shire Council, Cr. Joe Rettino, addressed the forum about working together to improve services and facilities in the community, then CEO, Gary Gaffney gave a presentation about the Shire, our economy, our advantages, and the role and importance of East Gippsland Shire in local service provision, employment, customer service, and balancing the many challenges of the region.

Kathryn McDonald, Community Development Officer, gave an informative presentation about the Shire's community grants program and we saw plenty of opportunities for small community grants to be sought for worthy projects. Martin Richardson outlined the **Community Bank**[®] branch Community Partnership program where funds are allocated every year to the community.

We wanted to identify improvements for the community that could be achieved by us working together and seeking support of others for practical, achievable results. We acknowledged that big projects are also important, but we might not be able to achieve those quickly or easily.

We wanted to focus on what could be done with our existing assets, resources and people and a little help from local, State or Commonwealth Government where required.

Through brainstorming and "voting" via stickers, we identified a number of worthy community projects that locals were interested in developing, improving and/or implementing. These ideas will be examined and projects identified and we will look for ways that they can be implemented, through either:

- The **Community Bank**[®] Branch Community Partnership Program
- East Gippsland Shire grants program
- Possible future funding from the Shire through its capital works program
- Partnerships and collaborations with local groups Paynesville Neighbourhood Centre, AJ Freeman Reserve Committee, Paynesville BTA
- Further project development and funding applications to State Government
- Advocacy on behalf of the community

We look forward to pursuing these important initiatives for our community.
