Chairman's report

Welcome to this edition of our newsletter in which I would like to elaborate a little on our sponsorships. Apart from assistance provided to the new Plantagenet Community Medical Centre, during the past year we have sponsored over 40 different organisations across a wide range of interest groups.

Youth and education

Contributions were made to the newly formed Porongurup Scout Group, which commenced with a full membership and the Mount Barker Girl Guides to assist with their ongoing operation.

We provided funding to the Kendenup Primary School for a set of encyclopaedias and science equipment and the Mount Barker Community College (Primary) for a set of garden beds to grow vegetables so students can learn how and where their food comes from. In addition to our annual scholarships, funding was also provided for senior students to represent the College at the Royal Show with their cattle and we also sponsored the school Chaplain.

Sporting

Numerous junior sporting groups were assisted including the Mount Barker Junior Bulls Football Club, under 16 Country Week cricket team, balls and hats for Kendenup Cricket juniors, the Mount Barker Speedway Club juniors and the Southern high and primary school netball competitions, as well as equipment for the junior hockey players.

At a senior club level, several golf competitions were sponsored at Mount Barker and Kendenup in addition

to the Pioneer Cup in Walpole and the ladies and men's Great Southern championships. The Mount Barker Amateur Swimming and Basketball Clubs were assisted as well as funding for the Mount Barker Bowls and Sporting Club for painting their clubrooms. The Plantagenet Archery club received funding to replace equipment lost in the Mount Barker fire earlier this year.

Community

The CWA was assisted in funding their extensions and the Childcare Centre was provided assistance for their garden. Funding was provided to the First Response Group in Kendenup for their new shed, the Rotary club for their annual Christmas Dinner and to the Plantagenet Historical Society museum for shelving. Riding for the Disabled was assisted once again and contributions made to the wild life carers in our community, as well as to the Friends of the Porongurup Range and the Wildflower Photo Competition.

In Walpole we sponsored their Family Centre, the Telecentre and the St Johns Ambulance for purchase of new equipment.

As you can see, many and varied community organisations benefit from your support of The Mount Barker **Community Bank®** Branch, helping to keep our community vibrant.

Accumulated business managed by Mount Barker **Community Bank**® Branch as at 30 June 2009 amounted to \$90 million, up from \$86 million at the same time last year. Business was split between lending of \$37 million and deposits of \$53 million spread across approximately 4,650 individual accounts.

Growing WA's communities

When Plantagenet Medical Centre in Mount Barker, 50 kilometres north of Albany, opens later in the year it will be a significant occasion – for two very important reasons.

Firstly, the region will have easy access to upto-date medical facilities, general practitioners, nursing staff, visiting specialists, pathology services and other health providers, such as physiotherapists.

And second, because the 5,000 - strong community has been able to raise the necessary capital to make the centre a reality.

In 2006, local doctors approached the Shire because they were operating out of an old building with no room for expansion so the Shire, with the community's support, decided to build a new medical centre and lease it to the Plantagenet Medical Group. The Shire contributed \$500,000 and received a number of Federal and State Government grants for the \$1.6 million project.

A \$200,000 interest free loan from Mount Barker **Community Bank®** Branch helped the Shire finalise the funding and will provide considerable savings for the Shire.

Stories like this one, from communities where **Community Bank**® branches operate, show what can be achieved and are a powerful incentive for community members to bank locally.

"The great thing about the **Community Bank®** model is that the community is in control," says Vicki Pearce, Bendigo Bank's WA State Manager. "They use the profits from their banking services, which are provided by Bendigo Bank, to develop and grow their community."

"There are now 37 **Community Bank**® branches in West Australia and they have returned \$3 million to their communities and \$2.2 million in dividends to shareholders. This represents a massive injection of cash into their local economy."

The Mount Barker community then, has every right to be proud of their achievement.

New Medical Centre



Construction is well advanced on the Shire of Plantagenet's new Medical Centre, which the Board of the **Community Bank®** branch has been pleased to have made a financial contribution to. It is understood that the centre will be open for business in November 2009, with the official opening on 2 December 2009.

In line with the philosophy of the Bendigo Bank Branch model, sponsorship of local community groups has been a priority from early on. However the Board was keen to find an iconic local project which it could sponsor which unlike others could demonstrate the benefits of this model. Right from the start of discussions with the Shire back in 2006, the **Community Bank®** branch saw the medical centre project as an important community facility which could benefit from the Bank's support.

The **Community Bank®** branch assisted the Shire with an interest free loan of \$200,000 to be paid back over 10 years.

A purpose built Medical Centre was designed encompassing six doctor and visiting specialist offices, two nurses' offices, allied health rooms and comfortable space for staff and patients.

There is no doubt that the \$200,000 interest free loan from the **Community Bank®** branch was vital in enabling the project to precede. Not only did the project require that degree of financial support, it has demonstrated the value of such partnerships to the community and other funding providers and we hope that that this will not be the last example in our region.

The involvement of the Mount Barker **Community Bank®** Branch in this project reinforces our
commitment to improving the prospects of the local
community, which is a most important component of
our charter. This initiative creates great awareness
to the general public, the majority of who will seek
medical services at some time, of the benefits of
supporting the local **Community Bank®** branch.
