# Branch Manager's message.



As we reach the conclusion of yet another year it is timely to reflect on where our business is positioned since our commencement.

In 2008 we opened with very little business and marked a milestone when our funds under management reached

\$20 million. In two years and two months we celebrated a further milestone when we recorded our first trading profit and had \$43 million in funds under management.

Along the way we started engaging with many of our local sporting clubs and supporting them with several projects. That support we offered has been returned with most of the clubs and their members choosing to bank with our **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> branch.

Our next milestone which occurred in 2012, was when our funds under management reached \$100 million and our first major grant of \$50,000 was provided to establish the Port Lincoln Home Hospice. Today the hospice is an established service employing a qualified nurse to assist those with a terminal illness to remain at home and to be treated with respect and dignity in their final days.

Given our determination to really make an impact and engage with our community, our business continued to grow. Clearly the quality of our service and our focused turnaround times played a clear part in seeing our business reach \$200 million in 2015 which coincided with need for the refurbishment of the Port Lincoln Leisure Centre and our subsequent contribution of \$230,000 - our largest single contribution to the community to date.

Having completed our monthly Board Meeting in November, I reported to the Board our funds under management have reached \$270 million. As our Chairman has indicated we are seeking a major project that will benefit our community. Port Lincoln in our view is a fantastic place to live and our **Community Bank**<sup>®</sup> company is committed to making its future as bright and prosperous for everyone. We can continue this work only with your help and support.

Remember, the \$2 million we have already contributed was made possible by our existing customers. If you are not one of them you haven't been part of this tremendous movement to take control of our destiny and keep banking profits in Port Lincoln. We would welcome you.
