

Sandringham & District Historical Society

was formed in February 1986 by a group of like-minded, local history enthusiasts from Sandringham and neighbouring suburbs. It has since grown to become a thriving and proactive organisation with a membership of around 100 and volunteer workforce of close to 50. In the past two years, it has adopted a more outward facing and contemporary profile by publishing its extensive collection of photographs, writings and artefacts online, opening an online shop offering both eBooks and hard copy publications, engaging with the local community through social media, creating opportunities for volunteers to work remotely and taking steps to capture contemporary history.

In March 2020, SDHS launched History in the Making, Creating a Covid 19 Community Archive. The project aims to

collect material documenting the impact of Covid-19 on our community and is

supported by partnership funds from
Sandringham Community Bank. We
will create and publish a historical
archive for access by current and
future generations. Readers,

At the Bamfield St Kitchen Garden and Community Orchard there has been harvesting of tomatoes, zucchinis, chillies, passionfruit and olives and production of jams, relishes, oils and



olives (see the images of the 40 jars including Cherry tomato relish, Passionfruit jam, Zucchini relish and Preserved olives!)

The Kitchen Garden Program will also continue at the new Bluff Rd school site with the planting out of garden beds outside classrooms, incorporating herbs/flowers etc to both beautify and integrate into the everyday community, planting the winter vegetables and herbs so it will be humming along by the time the students return to school.
