"While we have a small break, the Club has committed to offering winter training to our kids to maintain friendships and fitness. So little athletics does not sleep!!"

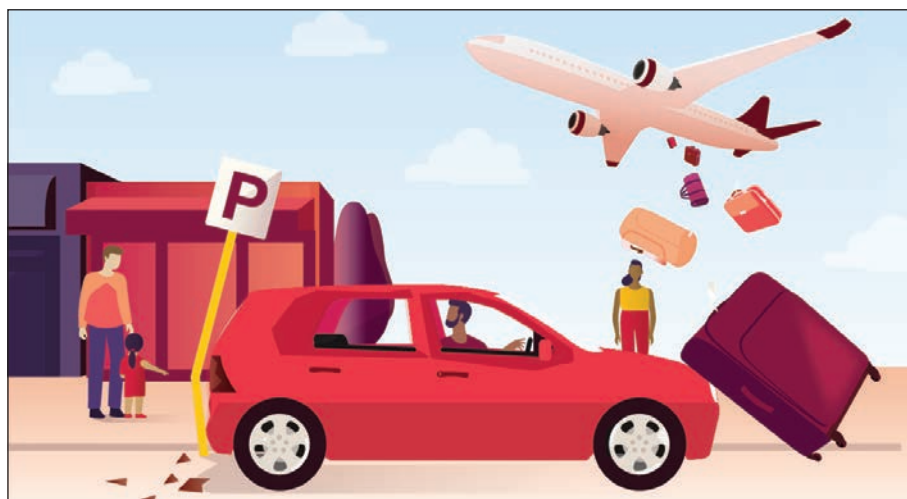
