We bought a car! Well, we bought the L2P Program a new car for Bayside - and we are thrilled!

The TAC L2P Program is a community-based program designed to assist young eligible drivers, particularly those who may be facing barriers to learning to drive, in acquiring the required 120 hours of supervised driving experience needed for a probationary license. It's a mentoring program where young people (aged 16-21) who may not have access to a supervising driver or vehicle are paired with fully licensed volunteer mentors for supervised driving practice.

With thanks to Anthony who has volunteered over 500 hours to the L2P program and best of luck to Brandon who is focussed on getting his license so he can work in demolition.

The L2P program is a wonderful community program and we are proud to have purchased multiple cars over the years so that we can get more teams out on the roads. Look out for it around the streets or parked at Sandringham Police Station.

Team Sports 4 All - Changing a Childhood



Julieta was 14 and facing challenges no child - no person - should have to face. Life felt overwhelming and hopeless. When a health professional suggested TeamSports4All, Julieta didn't think sport could possibly help. But with nowhere else to turn, she gave it a go.

That's when she met Fiona, a TeamSports4All volunteer. Fiona listened. She reassured Julieta that things could get better, and that she'd be with her every step of the way.

That same afternoon, Fiona contacted a local volleyball club, paid Julieta's registration, and organised her runners and uniform so she could walk into her first session looking just like every other girl on the team.

Julieta had never played organised sport before. She was scared, surrounded by strangers. Her sister gave her a gentle push and a few encouraging words, and Julieta took her first brave step onto the court.

From that day, everything changed.

She'd found a place where she felt safe. Coaches who encouraged her. Teammates who became friends. A club that felt like a second home.

"It's a really positive place. Like a safe haven," Julieta says.

She discovered a love and talent for the sport, and realised that what she was learning on the court - teamwork, confidence, perseverance - was helping her off the court too.

"Sport really changed my life. It helped me cope with what was happening around me. To build resilience."

Every child deserves a safe space. A community. The chance to thrive.

TeamSports4All provides everything a child needs - uniforms, footwear, registration fees, equipment - and stay with them season after season, for as long as they want to play. Our support model works because it's consistent, local, and focused on long-term change.

TeamSports4All can secure discounts through our club partnerships, meaning just \$500 can support a child for a full year of sport. Compare that to the \$1,000+ most families pay annually.

Unleashing a love of reading - StoryDogs

Helping encourage a love of reading among young school students, Community Bank Sandringham are supporting three teams of four-legged teacher's assistants, part of a not-for-profit program



designed to boost engagement and literacy skills.

In a small-scale, calm setting, school children are invited to read with the help of the dog's volunteer handler, building classroom confidence and helping reluctant readers discover the joy of books.

"We have some students who can sometimes be reluctant readers and this program has provided them with another way to build their confidence and self esteem and take the pressure off from the classroom."
