Board Chair's letter

Welcome to Community Bank Tongala's latest newsletter! This is an initiative first mooted by our Customer Relations Officer Hannah Tuxworth to rekindle a newsletter giving the community our side of the story. In this edition and following ones, you'll find articles by both staff and Board which will give the community a better insight into the running of the bank and the benefits of it to the community of Tongala and district.

Community Bank Tongala (formerly known as Tongala & District Community Bank Branch), came into existence after two of the 'Big 4' closed their doors in our town in 1999. The then Citizen's Advisory Group called for a Public Meeting and a Steering Committee was installed. A subsequent Public Meeting attended by some 250 people showed 'great support' for the establishment of a Community Bank of Bendigo Bank.

A Board of Directors was formed, headed by local baker Richard Herbert (Chair), Jill Regan (Secretary), Mick Hare (Finance), Ian Johnstone, Brendan Clarke, Ken Chapman and Rohan Garth. Greg Little was initially installed as Branch Manager and upon his departure, Colin Wells assumed that role. He was supported by Customer Service Officers Tamar Pankhurst, Kerryn Sullivan and Dale Haw.

The Board adopted a Distribution of Profit policy which took into account the following issues:

- 1. Monthly profit figures and annual operating costs;
- Establishment of cash reserves to cover operating costs, equipment replacements and the extension of services;
- 3. Cost of distribution to shareholders; and
- 4. Cost of distribution to community.

In essence this means that the profits of Community Bank Tongala were to be split 50/50 between shareholders and the community, a profit sharing arrangement which holds today.

In June 2008 Community Bank Tongala agreed to accept responsibility of operating an Agency out of the then Murray Shire (NSW) Service Centre at Mathoura. From humble beginnings, the agency has become a vital asset to the bank of which we are proud to be part of.

Our commitment to the towns and districts of Tongala and Mathoura is unwavering as the figure of some \$675,000 returned via sponsorships, grants and scholarships is testament. From the wisdom of our investors, our shareholders, to promote well-being within the community, we will continue our program of community support now and into the future. This is exemplified by the launching later in the year of our Tongala and Mathoura Higher School Scholarship Program for 2022.
