Southern business women are now connected.

Business women working on the Southern Gold Coast are now connected thanks to Tugun **Community Bank**[®] Branch. Southern Business Women Connect (SBWC) was started by the branch to provide an opportunity for women from Burleigh to the Border to meet and share their stories.

Hosted by Bridge from 92.5 Gold FM, the inaugural luncheon was held at the Currumbin RSL and featured a panel of dynamic local business women speaking about their experiences.

A total of 120 women (and a few men!) joined with State Member for Currumbin Jan Stuckey MP and the Mayoress of Gold Coast City, Mrs Ruth Tate, for an enjoyable afternoon beside the tranquil Currumbin Creek.

Chair of Tugun & District Finances Limited, Wendy Handley, said the event aims to promote the diversity of women in business on the Southern Gold Coast and hopes it will become an annual event. Other sponsors of the luncheon



included Currumbin RSL, John Flynn Private Hospital and the Southern Gold Coast Chamber of Commerce. Proceeds from the event were donated to local women's support and accommodation provider, Blair Athol.

Drumbeat.



The Drumbeat Program was originally introduced at Currumbin Primary School as a pilot program to support 'at risk' youth. Seeing the benefits for students with complex additional needs, Sally Taylor, the head of Student Support Services at the school, approached Tugun **Community Bank**[®] Branch with her vision to extend the program to more students. A grant of \$1,500 was provided which meant Sally could purchase six more Djembe Drums and have an additional staff member trained as a Facilitator for the program. Drumbeat is an evidence-based, award-winning intervention program that explores issues central to healthy relationships and lifestyles in a structured format. Some of the outcomes Sally has seen from the program include a reduction in tension, anxiety and stress and in anti-social behaviour. She has also noticed improved relationships with peers and teachers and increased school attendance.

Palm Beach Youth Music venture.

One of the worthy causes that we have supported from their beginning is the Youth Music Venture (formerly Palm Beach Youth Music Venture). The Youth Music Venture is a youth music initiative run by the local community, for the local community. They teach young musicians how to play in a band for free! They have now had over 120 participants through their annual program. The funds that Tugun **Community Bank**[®] Branch have provided have been used to purchase equipment for use in the program. We congratulate all involved with Youth Music Venture and look forward to their continued success and the successful outcomes of its participants.

Connecting Southern Gold Coast - Wendy Handley - Profile.

Tugun resident Wendy Handley has been the Chair of the Tugun **Community Bank**[®] Branch of Bendigo Bank for the past four years, having served on the Board since 2007 and being a foundation shareholder of the **Community Bank**[®] company since it opened its doors in 2003.

Wendy's long-term involvement with the **Community Bank**[®] branch is just the tip of the iceberg of the community-minded spirit she embodies. It is a fundamental belief that she says was instilled in her from a young age.

Moving as a family to the Gold Coast in the mid-1950s, Wendy's father Ron Pointon was part of the committee that raised funds to bring the then Southport Olympic Pool to the Gold Coast. Her parents were also involved in establishing the C&K Kindergarten in their community. Through their efforts they shared with her the basic ethos to not sit back and let others do the hard work but to be proactive and make a difference.

That served Wendy well through her 25-year career as a physiotherapist. Beginning at the age of 21, Wendy worked at the Coolangatta Community Health Centre, then later with organisations such as Montrose which is a Brisbane-based service that provides home and school services to children with disabilities (primarily providing physiotherapy to children with disabilities). "I was fortunate through that work to see first-hand the need for people who face difficulties for whatever reason, to be connected and valuable members of the community," Wendy said. Wendy and her husband Gerard have resided in Tugun for the past 18 years where Gerard runs his own medical practice. With adult children, Wendy splits her time as the Practice's Business Manager, and her voluntary role as Chair of Tugun & District Finances Limited. It's a busy role that sees Wendy actively out in the community meeting with and supporting local organisations. "A great part of it is meeting lots of interesting and talented people out there that I wouldn't otherwise have had the chance to meet," Wendy said.

"For me, the most rewarding part is seeing the interconnectedness of the groups we have supported over the years, especially those we have supported from the beginning. Having supported the Bleach Festival to get their Tugun event (Toolona Street Festival) off the ground four years ago, we also connected them to the Southern Beaches Community Garden and they are now working together in creating something special for this year's Festival."

"I'm proud that the branch has been central to those sorts of connections. We can really feel the Tugun **Community Bank**[®] Branch has grown along with the vibrancy of Tugun. As a result we've been able to support new events and organisations to make Tugun a more vibrant place to live, drawing younger families to live here."

"We have a great Board of Directors who have a range of backgrounds and experiences, ensuring the company runs well and is governed well. The **Community Bank**[®] company is owned by the local community and we have a responsibility to ensure it continues to be an asset to that community," Wendy said.
