Bayswater Strikers Soccer Club

The Bayswater Strikers Soccer Club eagerly awaited the 2021 Victorian Churches Football Association season to start after there was no season in 2020 due to COVID-19. Once restrictions were lifted and we could get together as a club again, pre-season was well underway in January, with everybody looking to increase their fitness and sharpen their skills after an extended period away from the game.

A successful recruitment campaign meant that there were plenty of new faces in all the men's and women's teams fighting for a position, which was a great result after the break. The season officially was underway 10 April, marking 581 days between the clubs last regular season match and the kick off of the 2021 season, celebrated with three wins and a draw to open the season for all teams.

The Bayswater Strikers Soccer Club had an exciting season, with solid performances from our new look Premier men's side, an extremely impressive campaign by our Premier women's team maintaining a ladder position in the top four throughout the year and continuing development through our Reserves and Division 2 teams.

Unfortunately, the pandemic reared its ugly head after round 12, putting a halt to the season by sending communities into lockdown. After suspending games with the intention to catch up the games with an extended season, the VCFA was forced to cancel the remainder of the season in August.

Although the comeback season did not result in an entire fixture of 18 rounds, the 48 total games that the Bayswater Strikers were able to play reignited our passion for the game we love and allowed us to come together socially off the pitch.

My Tokyo experience was certainly one to remember. It was very different to any major championship I have competed in for many reasons. Due to COVID-19 there were various rules and regulations in which us athletes had to adhere to. Masks were compulsory at all times except when training and competing, we had to get daily COVID-19 tests, we weren't able to leave the village, there were no spectators/crowds, and we ate in the dining hall with Perspex sheets separating us from other athletes just to name a few. This however did not stop me from making the most of the experience and the fact we were given the opportunity to compete at the Olympics during a global pandemic is something I will be forever grateful for. Placing seventh in the women's long jump final with a distance of 6.83m was more than I could have asked for after all the adversity I had faced in the lead up. It was the most competitive long jump final in the history of the Olympic Games which makes my seventh place seem all the more exciting.
