On the farm.... We are your partner in the paddock

Farmers in our district generally reported a bountiful harvest, despite the late finish because of January's wet conditions. Many of our customers were delighted with yields, and receival centres and on farm storages were full.

The Rural Bank Insights team and Australian Crop Forecasters reported the following:

- Total winter crop production for the Western Districts for the 2020/21 season was estimated to be around 450,000mt, a year-on-year increase of 5%, and 19% above average.
- Wheat (+24%), barley (+12%) and canola (+25%) production was all above average, so it was a good year all round.

Coming into the new season soil moisture levels were generally around average. However some areas remained below average and growers dry sowed in the hope of a decent rainfall. A downside lately has been the slugs and mice which are making it difficult for some farmers trying to get crops and pastures established.

But with the 2021 crops in the ground, everyone is hoping for another successful season ahead. Canola prices have remained high and cereals are slightly above long term averages, so things are looking positive in that regard.

Sheep have also done well, with adequate dry feed over summer and not a lot of hand feeding required. Prices remain high and wool is hanging in there. Cattle have also benefited from the season and prices for them remain high too.

All in all, everyone is hoping for another good year on the farm, especially since we all know that if farmers are doing well it helps our entire economy.

Once the Davis weather station has been connected to the Weatherlink device the Group will also be able to view real-time weather information 'on the go' using the Weatherlink mobile App.


