## Disaster appeals and grants

#### NSW Flood Appeal

Communities across New South Wales have recently been impacted by high levels of rain and floods, causing extensive damage to property, livestock and businesses.

Bendigo Bank's charitable arm, Community Enterprise Foundation<sup>™</sup>, is running a NSW Flood Appeal and funds will be directed to aid individuals and communities affected by these floods.

Your generous donations will help the short, medium, and long term recovery effort. Donations can be made at any Bendigo Bank branch or online at NSW Flood Appeal, Community Enterprise Foundation<sup>™</sup>. All donations of \$2 or more are tax deductible and donors will be provided with a tax receipt through the Foundation.

#### National Bushfire Disaster Appeal – first grant round supports NSW South Coast recovery.

In the first grant round from the 2020 Bendigo Bank National Bushfire Disaster Appeal \$634,000 was granted to recovery on the NSW South Coast (Shoalhaven, Eurobodalla and Bega Valley). Congratulations to all the recipients for their hard work and dedication to bushfire recovery in our community including Southern Youth and Family Services; Shoalhaven Suicide Prevention and Awareness; Shoalhaven Education Fund; Sussex Inlet Chamber of Commerce; Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR); Yumaro; and Ulladulla Community Resources Centre.

#### Youth Education and Workplace Pathways Grants – more than 100 young people in the Shoalhaven receive grants.

Bendigo Bank and The Salvation Army jointly established a \$4 million Youth Education and Workplace Pathways Grants program for young people in bushfire affected communities.

The program assists 15 to 25-year-olds in communities impacted by the 2020 bushfires by awarding \$3,000 cash grants to support their educational development and further their future workplace aspirations. By early 2021 over 800 applications had been funded of which 420 scholarships valued at \$1.26 million have been distributed across the Shoalhaven, Eurobodalla and Bega Valley and this includes 101 scholarships valued at \$303,000 in our local southern Shoalhaven community.

## Scholarship recipients helping our community.

The Sonder Youth Changemakers Program empowers young people to design and implement youth-driven projects in their communities. In 2020 we provided four scholarships for the Changemakers Program. Three of the four Community Bank Milton & Districts and Sussex Inlet scholarship recipients, Charlotte Walker, Jasmine Klimiuk and Nicola Boyle (pictured together on page 1), teamed up to work on a project called "Bio Enviro" to reduce plastic pollution in our region by providing reusable alternatives to single-use plastic items. These three changemakers and Bio Enviro are now working with Sonder Youth Ltd and Shoalhaven City Council to develop an

education program about plastic waste and pollution for high school students which will run during 2021.

The fourth scholarship recipient, Ruby Lea, developed an upcycled clothing initiative called "Eunoia Vintage Apparel". Ruby collects second-hand clothing, which would otherwise have been discarded, and alters them for second-hand use. Ruby sells the items at a youth market with profits donated to charities fighting the fast fashion trend.

Sonder Youth's founder Avalon Bourne told us "In spite of the challenging circumstances this year, thanks to your contribution we were able to conduct a successful Changemakers Program. Thank you for your valuable support of young people in the region through this program. Both participants and our communities are better for it!"

## Community EFTPOS facility

## One more way we're helping our locals build better lives.

Do you know that Community Bank Milton & Districts and Sussex Inlet offer a merchant facility to assist our local community groups with their not for profit fundraising events.

#### Who can apply?

Any community groups (non-profit) are eligible to apply for the hire of the Community POS terminal. This could include sporting groups, schools or charitable clubs, for events such as school fetes, registration days, a trivia night or other fundraising events. The community group must have an account with Bendigo Bank.

If you have an event coming up and need an alternative way for attendees or donors to make payments, please talk to the team at Community Bank Milton & Districts and Sussex Inlet branches for more information.

Please note that for non-profit community organisations we waive the hiring fee for the mobile EFTPOS however transaction fees do apply.
